Lewis Carroll's popular children's story of "Alice in Wonderland" will be presented on "Comedy Playhouse" at 7. The story is a perennial holiday favorite with children. Joseph Curran, national president of the National Maritime Union, CIO, will be the interview-guest on "Meet the Press" (8:30 to 9 p. m.). He will be interviewed by Murray Davis, N. Y. World-Telegram; Victor Riesel, labor columnist for the N. Y. Daily Mirror; and Lawrence Spivak, editor, American Mercury Magazine.

Replacing the regular "Wrestling Parade" one time tomorrow night is a special Christmas presentation entitled "Our Christmas Stocking," with Dick Haymes as emcee. Oregon Demo Chief Predicts Victories In 1950

WASHINGTON, (AP)—Oregon's democratic national committeeman, Monroe Sweetland, predicted here his party will win next year some of the state's seats in Congress—all now occupied by Republicans.

Sweetland, here to talk with Democratic national committee officials, said Democrats will contest in each of the four congressional districts and also try to unseat Senator Morse.

The state's Democrats, he said, "are determined to win the governorship."

He told a news conference that Norris Dodd, international food administrator; assistant Secretary of Interior C. Girard Davidson and Richard L. Neuberger, state senator of Portland, may be candidates for the democratic nomination for U. S. senator.

Sweetland said Secretary of the Interior Oscar Chapman will address the Jefferson-Jackson day dinner in Portland April 15.
