



SATURDAY: President Truman's annual Christmas Eve message to the people will be heard from Independence, Missouri (3-3:30 p. m.). The broadcast will also feature the White House Christmas tree lighting ceremonies and an address by Secretary of the Interior Oscar Chapman. Christmas Eve will mark the debut of a new show on Mutual-Don Lee's Saturday night parade of audience participation programs when the Hollywood-originated "Com-edy of Errors" appears in the 6-6:25 p. m. time period. The program will spotlight Jack Bailey of "Queen for a Day," in a new and different role. He will be featured in a series of comedy sketches containing errors in sound effects, music, action and dialogue, and heads a cast of top comedy actors for this new series. Lewis Carroll's popular children's story of "Alice in Wonderland" will be presented on "Comedy Playhouse" at 7. The story is a perennial holiday favorite with children. Joseph Curran, national president of the National Maritime union, CIO, will be the interview-guest on "Meet the Press" (8:30 to 9 p. m.). He will be interviewed by Murray Davis, N. Y. World-Telegram; Victor Riesel, labor columnist for the N. Y. Daily Mirror; and Lawrence Spivak, editor, American Mercury Magazine.
