## **Kell Noses Out Ted Williams** By Decimal In Taking Batting **Leadership In American Loop**

CHICAGO, Dec. 23.—(AP)—George Kell of Detroit was credited today as the first third baseman ever to win the American league batting crown—and he did it with the closest finish

on record.

The 170-pound Tiger, collecting two hits on the final day of the 1949 season, sheded Boston's Tad Williams, who has held hitless in his last game, 3429 to .3427. Williams missed becoming a five-time winner of the crown by two ten-thousands of a point in the slide-rule windup.

There have been one point margins before, but never has the edge had such a decimal decision as this one. Goose Goslin of Washington grabbed the 1928 title by one point. Buddy Myer of Washington had the same close shave in 1935.


