The annual Blue-Gray football contest, featuring the outstanding gridiron stars of the North against those of the South, will be described exclusively over the Mutual-Don Lee network, in the "Gillette Cavalcade of Sports" series. The Blue (North) grid will feature outstanding players from such northern grid powerhouses as Pittsburgh, Penn State, Dartmouth, Cornell and Fordham.

The 25th annual football classic between all-star East and West football teams will also be presented exclusively over Mutual-Don Lee in Gillette's "Cavalcade of Sports." This silver anniversary meeting, normally a New Year's day event, will be played this year on Saturday, Dec. 31, and will follow immediately the annual Blue-Gray game broadcast from Montgomery, Alabama. The East-West broadcast will feature Ernie Smith on the play-by-play descriptions, with Mel Venter handling the statistics of the game, and color.
