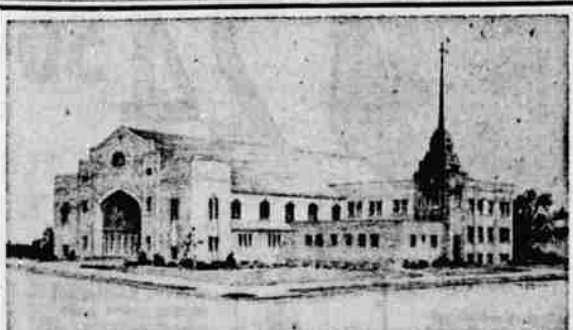

Eugene's chief of police, Keith L. Jones, during a short speech before the Roseburg Rotary club Thursday at the Hotel Umpqua, emphasized the need in Oregon for a law to effectively cover the actions of persons who tend to be "constitutionally psychopathic inferiors."

What he termed "a common hazard—as common as a cold and, many times, quite as hard to handle and cure," Chief Jones pointed out that a good example is the "drunk" or "alcoholic." The alcoholic, as many other cases, does not learn from past experience but moves with a sort of compulsion, the police officer said. "They are not able to assume their responsibility toward society," he maintained.

Under the state law the actions of the psychopath or sex deviate are most times considered a misdemeanor, unless an actual crime of force is committed, Jones said. Molestation is hard to do anything about, he emphasized, under the present state laws.

Pertinent Case Cited
The police chief recalled the case of Joe Walker, who was forced to leave Eugene because of sex deviation acts, and was later charged in Colorado with the murder of a young university coed. This case could have been prevented, the chief said, if the Eugene police department had had legal machinery with which to act. With the legal machinery, many potential crimes could be avoided through preventive clinical care, he said. Clinical treatment of most of these persons is successful, Jones stated. Some persons show delinquent tendencies as early as eight years old.

Looking into the cause of common psychopath, Chief Jones said that primarily the cause comes from a disarranged childhood—one in which the feeling of the mother for the father is not normal and happy. This causes a "kicking out" against society by these people, many of whom are intelligent and normal in many other ways.

In closing, the chief called for legislative action to cover, and plead by the North Roseburg church since it opened in September. Bishop E. W. Praetorius, North-western area bishop of the Evangelical United Brethren church, will appear as guest speaker at the North Roseburg church Sunday, Jan. 22, to officially dedicate the chapel and parsonage occupied by the North Roseburg church since it opened in September.

The affair will attract laymen from other Evangelical United Brethren churches throughout the Willamette valley and Portland area, since the North Roseburg church was begun as a mission project, through money and labor donated by these churches. "Bishop's Sunday," as Jan. 22 has been tabbed, will be a big day for the Sunday school, also. Superintendent Ralph Arensmeyer announced that an enrollment of 100 in the Sunday school has been set as the goal for "Bishop's Sunday." Since a visitor is enrolled as a regular member only after attending three times, Mr. Arensmeyer emphasized that this coming Sunday will be the latest date a visitor can start, if he wants to qualify as an enrolled member by Jan. 22.
