"Bossy Gillis" Is
Making Good On
Political Threats

NEWBURYPORT, Mass., Jan. 7.—(P)—This seaport city's "bad boy mayor" of a few years ago—voiced back to office in November—la carrying out threats of changes.

During his three previous terms, Mayor Andrew J. "Bossy" Gillis amazed Newburyport residents with his antics.

Apparently, he has not "slowed down" as much as he claims. Gillis—who describes himself as "no diplomat"—became involved in two disputes this week—only three days after he officially took office.

The fiery mayor refused to grant the customary license for the showing of motion pictures on Sunday to a theater and then ordered the discharge of a policeman.

He said he refused to grant the Port theater the Sunday license because of "political reasons." He has sole authority over the issuing of such licenses. The two other theaters in the city were granted them.

But Gillis may be in for a fight over his order to discharge policeman Michael J. Carney, 52, a veteran of both World Wars. The mayor gave no reason for his order, but described him as a "special officer."

Carney, however, has been a permanent member of the police force since 1946, and under law cannot be discharged without civil service proceedings. He said he would ignore the order and report for duty as usual.

Slips On This One
In a third case, Gillis apparently became confused.

He appointed Aaron D. Woods as a member of the board of registrars to replace Leon F. Oliver. But when Woods went to city hall to take his oath, it was discovered Oliver's term has two more years to run.

Gillis explained: "It was an honest mistake."

Gillis, during his first term in 1928, was sentenced to two months in jail for cutting down elm trees to make an entrance for his gasoline station. He ran the city from his cell.

Later, he astounded residents even more by climbing through a second story window of a new high school to make an inspection. He had been refused a key by the school committee.

On another occasion, he threatened to have cows feed on the city hall lawn when denied funds for a grass cutter.

This earned him the nickname which since has stuck with him—"bossy."

Youthful Couple
Faces Charges Of
Postal Burglary

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 7.—(P)—Noah Morgan, 22, and his 17-year-old wife, Jean, were ordered removed to Spokane, Wash., Thursday for trial on postoffice burglary charges.

Federal Judge Louis E. Goodman signed the order sending the youthful couple to Spokane under custody. The Morgans were arrested in Santa Cruz Dec. 30.

M. F. Blake, Spokane postoffice inspector, said the Morgans and two men were charged with burglary of postoffices at Johnston, Thornton and Benton City,

The two men are in custody—Robert E. Morin, in Spokane and Lee Royle Cline, in Butte, Mont. Blake said the burglaries netted only \$630 in cash, but blank money order forms potentially worth \$73,700 were taken at Benton City.
