Mrs. Campbell was born January 3, 1860, near Kelley's Corner and was one of nine children of Jacob and Sarah Spaur, prominent Douglas county pioneers. She has one living sister, Mrs. Minerva Smith, who now resides in Richmond, Calif.

Mrs. Campbell has a daughter, Mrs. Willis Myers, Roseburg, and a son, James Campbell, who is with the U.S. Navy department at Bremerton, Wash. She has two granddaughters, Mrs. Victor Bean (Jean Myers) and Marilyn Myers, of Roseburg and a grandson, George Campbell of Bremerton, and two great-granddaughters, Vicki and Christi Bean, both of Roseburg.

Mrs. Campbell, who is called Temple by her friends, is a member of the First Presbyterian church and Roseburg Rebekeah lodge No. 41. She is still ardently interested in politics. Her health is excellent and she enjoys numerous associations with both old and young friends.
