Washington State, OSC, Oregon Tied For Second In North

Washington, USC and UCLA are the big three in Pacific Coast conference basketball today, but the situation is due for some alteration next weekend.

The Trojans and the Bruins, tied for the southern division lead with two victories each, hook up in Los Angeles. Washington puts its northern division lead on the block in two meetings with Washington State's Cougars, pre-season favorites to cop the northern title.

Beat Idaho.

Last Friday and Saturday, Coach Art McLarny's Huskies swept their opening two game series from Idaho. This gives them 12 triumphs in 13 starts—mostly on their home floor.

They face the Cougars at Pullman, however.

Washington edged past Idaho, 44 to 40, Saturday. The night before the Huskies breezed to a 67 to 43 victory.

Washington State gained a split on its four game road trip dumping Oregon, 54 to 46. With a 2 and 2 record, the Cougars are tied for second place with Oregon and Oregon State, each at 1 and 1.

Besides the Washington-WSC series, one other northern division game is on schedule. Oregon faces Oregon State Friday at Corvallis.

Friday and USC's defeat of Stanford leaves the bay area hoopmen sharing the division cellar. They collide next weekend to decide who stays there.

Single Olympic Games City In U. S. Sought

WASHINGTON, (AP)—To bring the Olympic games back to the United States, Avery Brundage is going to fight again for a single city as the national candidate for host in 1960. The games have not been held here since 1923.

Brundage, re-elected president of the United States Olympic association, told a reporter that he hoped by tightening the rules of his group a repeat of last spring's troubles in Rome would be prevented.

At Rome, three U.S. cities bid for the 1956 games, and the result was a split vote which ruined U.S. chances, Brundage said.

Twelve Roseburg bowling teams will participate in two of the year's big bowling events, which opened at Portland Saturday.
