From the Wednesday, January 4, "Wall Street Journal" comes word of the phonograph-record war. . . The feud is entering a new phase . . . one that promises to prolong its life. There are two major developments. RCA-Victor, sponsor of the 45 speed, announced that on March 1 it will begin to produce 33 1/3 r.p.m. records. It will put only its classical numbers on these long-playing discs, which were introduced by its rival, Columbia Records, 18 months ago. Columbia, meantime, is getting ready for big production and sale of popular tunes on single small (7 inch) 33 1/3 records. Capitol Records have been making all three speeds for the past six months. The big question: what will Decca Records do? Decca is one of the "big three" record makers. It holds a "balance of power" that can be tossed either way in the Victor-Columbia struggle. Decca now makes 33 1/3, and 78 speed recordings. Will it also make 45's—thus strengthening Victor's hand? For the record buyers, all this means that to enjoy a full choice of new recordings, they'll need equipment to play three speeds . . . and . . . super-patience. They will, however, have a wider range of artists and tunes.

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One Attack Does Not Immunize Against Polio

One attack of polio may not mean immunity for life, it was revealed today by Al Henninger, chairman of the Douglas county chapter of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis.

The chairman of the March of Dimes organization stated that a recent research report from national headquarters indicates there are at least three kinds of polio virus capable of producing the human disease and that infection with one does not result in resistance to either of the other two.

Prior to the knowledge that three kinds of polio virus exist, Henninger said, physicians had been puzzled by the numerous instances of polio occurring more than once in certain individuals. He recalled the case of a young girl in Texas during last summer's epidemic, who came down with an attack of polio just one week before she was to enter the hospital for surgery on a leg which had been paralyzed by polio two years previously.

"More of these cases," he declared, "are being reported by physicians. Recognition of the three different polio viruses now offers a sound scientific explanation for these tragic multiple attacks."

Henninger revealed that scientists believe there may be other polio viruses in addition to the three recently discovered. He added that last year \$1,370,000 in March of Dimes funds were given to four leading universities to determine the actual number of polio viruses existing.

"If a possible preventive for polio such as a vaccine is to be made," he went on, "scientists must first know how many polio viruses are capable of causing the human disease."

The four universities engaged in this essential polio research, according to the chairman, are University of Southern California, University of Utah, University of Pittsburgh, and the University of California.

He concluded with the statement that a deadline had been set for the completion of this study by the end of 1951.

VISITORS DECREASE

PORTLAND, Jan. 9. — (P) — Visitors to Bonneville dam and to Cottage Grove dam increased last year, the army engineers reported today.

Bonneville got 634,350 tourists. Cottage Grove dam, on the coastal fork of the Willamette River, had 65,578.

For Ridge dam, however, drew fewer visitors: 118,280 compared to 120,387 the previous year. That dam is on the Long Tom river.

TRAFFIC DEATHS DOWN

SALEM, Jan. 9. — (P) — Oregon's 1949 traffic death toll was 357, the secretary of state reported today.

It was the third successive year that fatalities have declined in Oregon. There were 419 traffic deaths the year before.

Oregon's record would have been better, except for December. That was the worst month of 1949.

National Forest Timber For Sale

Oral auction bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor, Roseburg, Oregon, beginning at 2:00 p. m. Pacific Standard time, January 27, 1950, for all the live timber marked or designated for cutting and all merchantable dead timber located on an area embracing about 152 acres within sections 30 and 32, T27S, R2W, W.M., Umpqua National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 7,500,000 feet B.M., more or less Douglas-fir, 310,000 feet B.M., more or less Western red cedar, and 620,000 feet B.M., more or less of western hemlock and other species of saw-timber. Sealed bids accompanied by required payment and received by the Forest Supervisor prior to 2:00 p. m., Pacific Standard time, January 27, 1950, will be considered the equivalent of an oral bid and posted for information of all bidders. No bid of less than \$8.60 per M feet for Douglas-fir, \$0.85 per M feet for Western red cedar, and \$0.75 per M feet for western hemlock and other species will be considered. In addition to the prices bid for stumpage a co-operative deposit of \$0.10 per M feet B.M., to be used by the Forest Service for paying the cost of slash disposal, a cooperative deposit of \$0.40 per M feet B.M., to cover the cost of tree planting, seed sowing and timber stand improvement work on the area cut over, for the total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement, will be required. \$8,000.00 must accompany each sealed bid and must be shown to be in the possession of oral bidders as a qualification for auction bidding. If an oral bid is declared to be high at the closing of the auction, the bidder must immediately make the required payment and confirm the bid by submitting it in writing on a Forest Service bid form. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Before bids are submitted, full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale and the submission of bids should be obtained from the Forest Supervisor, Roseburg, Oregon, or the District Ranger, Glendale, Oregon.
