Cincinnati, Auburn Join Beaten Ranks

Cincinnati and Auburn were toppled from the unbeaten ranks but it was Tulsa which provided last night's surprise in college basketball.

Tulsa turned in a 42-36 victory over Wichita, a team which figured to breeze. Wichita previously had beaten the Oklahoma Aggies and Oklahoma City U., but Ken Dobbs held Wichita's star, John Friedersdorf, to four points and that was that.

Tulsa thus registered its first Missouri Valley conference triumph in two years and temporarily at least is tied with mighty Bradley for the conference lead.

Duquesne Wins
Duquesne ended Cincinnati's 17 game winning streak, counting 11 from last season, 60-54, and Georgia Tech shattered Auburn's

eight-game streak, 65-49, in a Southeastern conference. Gray Duquesne, ranked eighth in the latest Associated Press poll, now has won 10 straight and is still undefeated.

Long Island and CCNY, ranked third and seventh in the A. P. poll, cemented their claim to high ranking. Long Island again came from behind in the second half to whip St. Louis, 58-42, in the feature half of a Madison Square Garden doubleheader, after CCNY had swamped West Virginia, 80-55. Sherman White again sparked LIU with 20 points.

Kansas Beaten
Nebraska upset Kansas, 57-56, in a Big Seven game with Nebraska successfully freezing the

ball for the last 50 seconds. Big Bus Whitehead tossed in 26 points for Nebraska and held Clyde Lovelette, Kansas star, to 12 points.

Texas Christian upset Southern Methodist, 62-50, in the Southwest conference while San Francisco, back home after a poor eastern tour, whipped Santa Clara, 50-36.

TAX PLAN OPPOSED

PORTLAND, Jan. 11. — (P) — Both the retail trade bureau and the central labor council voted Monday to oppose the city's proposed \$25 tax on persons working in the city but living elsewhere.

Kelly Low, a member of the city's advisory committee on taxes, told the labor council the non-resident tax was evidence the city wasn't facing up to a long-range financial problem. He said revenue plans to ease the threatened deficit have been stop-gap measures.

Bets Favor Churchill For Prime Minister Job

LONDON, Jan. 11. — (P) — One of Britain's biggest bookmakers made the Labor party a 4-to-6 favorite today to win the 1950 general election.

Douglas Stuart offered 5-to-4 against Winston Churchill's Conservatives.

At the same time, however, he made Churchill himself a hairline favorite over Labor's Clement Attlee to be the next prime minister of Britain.

Churchill was quoted at 11 to 8, Attlee at 6 to 4.

The reasoning behind this: If the Conservatives win Churchill is almost certain to become prime minister. If Labor is victorious Attlee may step down to make way for another member of his party.

Churchill also is considered a good bet to take the helm if the election is so close that no party gets a majority and a coalition government is formed.

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Notre Dame's Hart Accepts Grid 'Oscar'

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 11. — (P) — Leon Hart, Notre Dame's great all-America end who is considering a career in the movies, today holds football's equivalent of an "oscar."

Hart came to Philadelphia last night to accept the Maxwell Memorial Football club's award as the best college grid player of 1949.

The 21-year-old native of Turley Creek, Pa., accepted the honor with deep humility from club President Bert Bell, commissioner of the pro National-American Football League.

Overturning the pudgy, five-foot-eight Bell by nine inches, Hart said simply:

"I can think of many college players throughout the country who are more worthy of receiving this trophy, including many of my own Notre Dame teammates."

Hart, who will marry his home town sweetheart—Lois Newmyer—Feb. 7, said he's set to make a screen test for Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer before March 1. It's for a feature part in a remake of the screen epic "Quo Vadis."

Awaiting Test Result
"If the test comes out all right, I won't have time for pro ball," commented the business-minded Hart, who readily admits he may never win an "oscar" for outstanding acting.

He knows the terrific publicity power of his name is a big selling point today.

Hart graduated from the South Bend, Ind., university in June with a mechanical engineering degree. He admits "It's pretty

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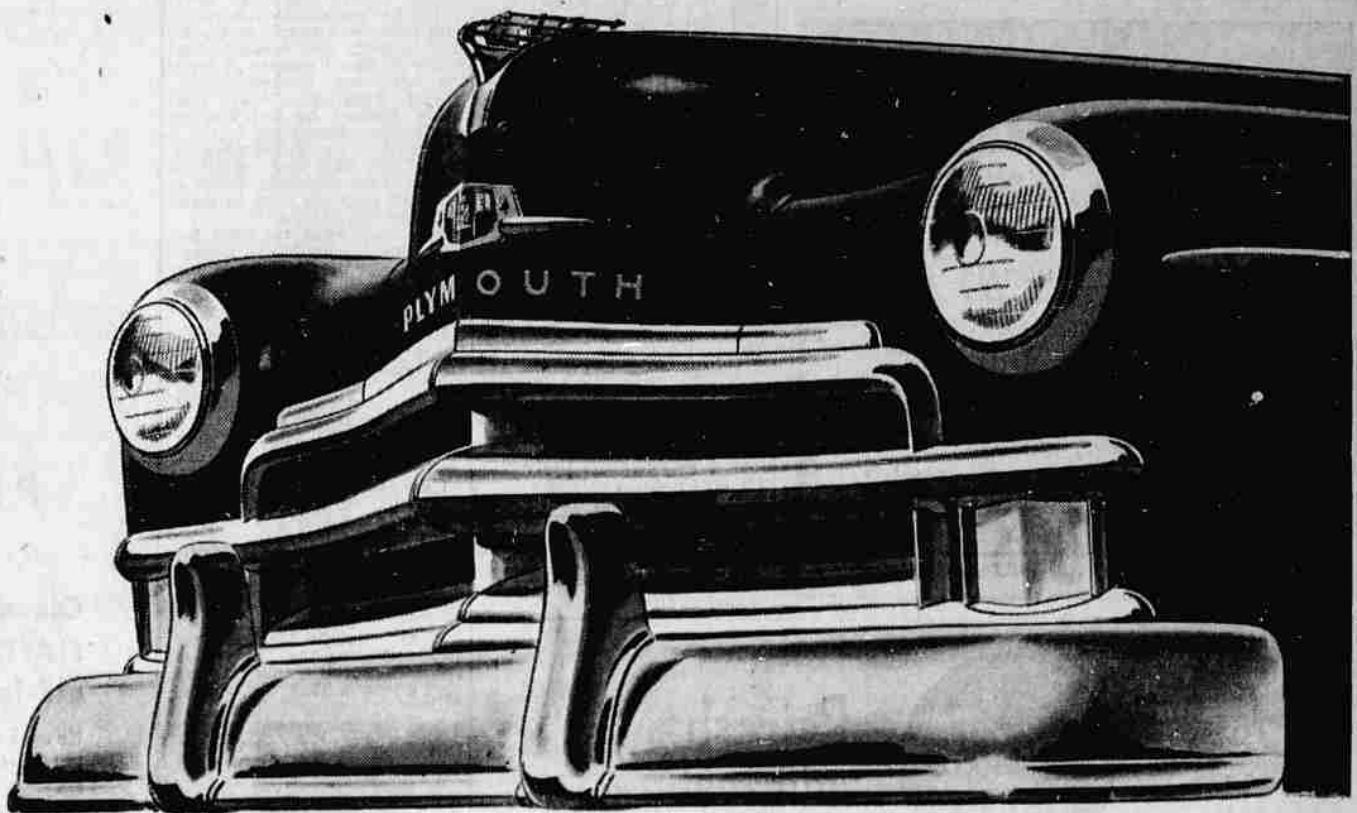


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
