WASHINGTON, Jan. 20.—(AP)—President Truman talked over his tax plans with Democratic congressional leaders and tax experts today and got some suggestions from them for changes.  
White House officials said afterward that Mr. Truman still planned to send a special tax message to Congress next week. There was no indication whether there has been any change in his announced plan to propose a "moderate" tax boost as well as revisions of present tax laws.  
Mr. Truman is expected to propose cuts in some excise taxes along with increases in other taxes to make up for the revenue lost by those cuts.
