

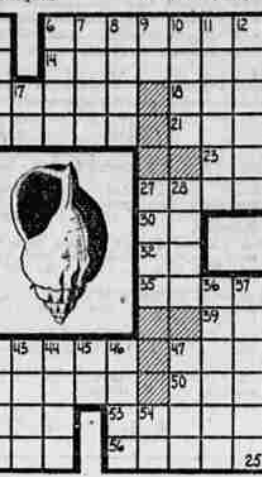

Strong Trends Prevail In Some U. S. Industries; Coal Shortage Causes Fear

NEW YORK. —(AP)—Strong trends prevailed in some industries last week but overall business conditions were clouded by uncertainties and fears caused by a menacing coal shortage.

It was clear that business and industry will be in for some tough sledding unless peace and production return to the coal fields at an early date.

An indication of things to come if the miners continue their three-day week and rotational strike was afforded by scattered cutbacks in steel mills this week, drastic rationing of coal in numerous cities and the touch-and-go situation at many large power plants supplying important industrial areas.

Trouble Approaching

A survey by the Associated Press of conditions caused by the prolonged under-production of coal disclosed many areas were in trouble or fast approaching it.

Pittsburgh, heart of the nation's industrial empire, drew more than ordinary interest because of the large number of steel mills and other heavy industry plants in the area that depend on commercial electric power.

The big Duquesne Light Co., principal supplier in the district, was saved from the necessity of cutting off power to several hundred industrial plants late in the week only after a last-minute pledge of a small supply of coal from an out-of-state dealer.

There was nothing in the cards guaranteeing that the crisis would not make a return call on the industrial city and others as well early this week. The President once more shunned the Taft-Hartley act as a means of forcing a showdown; the slow moving court procedure set in motion by the labor board's complaint against Mr. Lewis offered no immediate help, and no one expected the union to end the trouble voluntarily.

Production Good

Allowing for the disquieting influences of the coal shortage and a series of bad weather breaks, including floods in the rich Mississippi delta and unseasonably cold spells in western states, industrial production was at an excellent rate last week.

Electric power output went to an all-time high at 6,028,588,000 kilowatt hours.

Automobile production hit a four-month high at 157,950 units in this country and Canada. This compared with 154,532 in the previous week and 113,302 last year.

The country's steel mills turned out 1,810,300 tons of products last week—highest since early last April—and compared with 1,791,900 in the preceding week and 1,845,400 a year ago.

Other high points on the business chart this week included a record-setting pace in the building industry which produced heavy engineering construction contracts totaling \$182,177,000, nearly double last year's \$96,601,000.

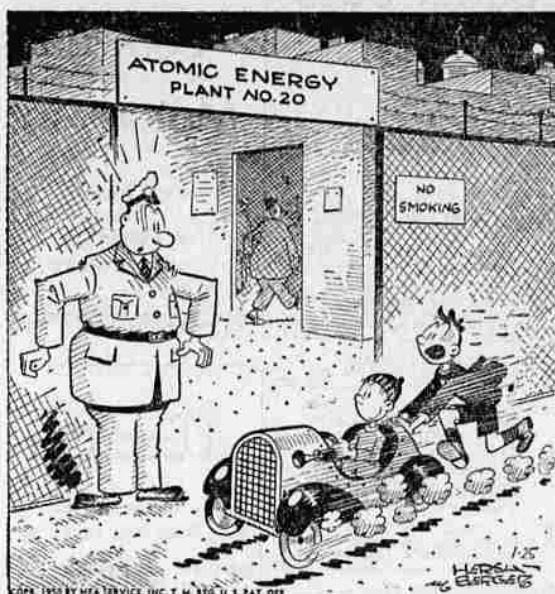
