

DiMaggio, Robinson Signed For All-Time High Salaries

NEW YORK, Jan. 25 — (AP) — New York's two pennant winners—the American league Yankees and the National league Brooklyn Dodgers—today had signed up the highest salaried players in their history.

For the second successive season, the Yankees yesterday signed Joe DiMaggio, their great outfield star, to a contract calling for an estimated \$100,000. A few hours before DiMaggio accepted one of the highest salaries ever paid to a player, Jackie Robinson inked a Dodger pact calling for \$35,000.

Rickey Tells Signing
Branch Rickey, Dodger president, announced the Robinson signing following a short discussion of terms.

"Robinson will be the highest paid Dodger in my Brooklyn experience," he said. Rickey has been boss in fiat since the start of the 1943 season.

Although salaries are rarely made public, it is believed that Dazzy Vance's \$100,000 for three years was the most money ever paid to a Brooklyn player. First Negro in Majors
The 31-year-old Robinson, first negro in major league baseball and likewise first of his race to be named most valuable player, earned \$22,000 last year. He won the National league batting title with a .342 average. Also, he batted in 124 runs, hit 16 home runs and led the circuit with 37 stolen bases.

DiMaggio, 35, got his first \$100,000 contract last year. That topped Babe Ruth's previous Yankee high of \$80,000 in 1930-31. Sidelines for half the season with a heel injury DiMag appeared in 76 games and batted .346.

Thorpe Receives Another Honor
HARRISBURG, Pa., Jan. 25 — (AP) — Jim Thorpe, already voted the No. 1 football player of the last 50 years in a nation-wide poll, will receive another honor tonight.

The 61-year-old Sac and Fox Indian will be designated "the greatest athlete in Pennsylvania history. The award will be made by Gov. James H. Duff at the annual dinner of the Harrisburg Sports Writers association.

Tomorrow, Thorpe will visit nearby Carlisle, Pa., where he first gained fame as a member of the Carlisle Indians football team.
