

Pendleton Presbyterians Adopt Cultured Polish Family

PENDLETON, Jan. 26. — (AP) — The First Presbyterian church has adopted Kir Kuklowsky, former conductor of the International Symphony orchestra, his wife, Elizabeth and baby boy, Frederick.

The three Kuklowskys are displaced persons brought here a week ago by the Presbyterian church through the DP committee of the Church World Service.

The church fixed them up with a furnished house, stocked with food, and got musician Kuklowsky a job. Both he and his wife are Ukrainians.

He directed the International Symphony orchestra in Poland and Munich for 12 years before the war. He is a pianist, composer

of a full-length symphony, several piano forte pieces, songs for different voices and a book of songs for children. The English words were written by Elizabeth.

At the outbreak of the war, he fought in the Polish army. He was captured by the Germans and kept in a concentration camp for nine months.

His ambition is to organize and conduct an orchestra at the church. He is almost finished with a new symphony "From the Old World" which he will dedicate to his friends here.

His wife was an inorganic chemist at a Russian industrial laboratory for two years. She speaks French, German, Russian, Ukrainian and is rapidly learning English.

New Orleans Reform Mayor Wins In Primary

NEW ORLEANS, Jan. 26. — (AP) — De Lesseps Morrison, youthful reform mayor of New Orleans, won re-nomination for another four-year term Tuesday.

His administration made a clean sweep of the Democratic primary. Democratic nomination here means election.

Complete unofficial returns from the city's 307 precincts gave Morrison 120,229 votes to 58,701 for Charles Zatarain, an Independent.
