U. S. Warned To Ever Guard Its Four Freedoms

"America has not found the secret to eternal perpetuity. No nation in history has ever found it!"

With this statement Capt. Kenneth Anderson, Salvation Army, Portland, sounded a warning before the members of the Rotary club, that the people of the United States must be ever vigilant to guard our four freedoms.

Despite our present position of world greatness we must remember that we do not have the secret to perpetuity, he said, and there are those among us who are not interested in perpetuating our freedom.

Capt. Anderson told a story entitled "Blood on the Moon." It was the story of how a family tumbled out of bed on a Sunday morning to find that the "funny papers" had not been delivered. The members of the family turned on the radio, but a voice kept repeating, "Stay tuned for an important announcement and stay indoors."

When the announcement finally came, it was, "Welcome, comrades, to the commonwealth of Soviet republics."

How had it happened? How could we be free last night and today be a member of another

country? Capt. Anderson noted several questions which the people would ask, but which might never be answered.

"Righteousness exalteth a nation," Capt. Anderson quoted from the Bible. We should enjoy the privilege of religious worship, he said.

What happened in the story can happen here, like it has happened in other places, the officer warned.

Concluding, Capt. Anderson quoted the words of Thomas Jefferson, who said, "Eternal vigilance is the price of peace."

Extension Of DP Law Urged By Church Council

FOREST GROVE—(AP)—The Oregon Council of Churches closed its annual convention here with an appeal for extension of the displaced persons law.

A resolution said more homeless Europeans should be permitted to enter the country as early as possible.

Other resolutions called for these studies: The proposed Columbia valley administration, but did not take a stand on the issue; possible use of stored food supplies for relief in foreign countries; and whether the Portland council and the state group should merge.

The convention asked member churches to cooperate with parent organizations, such as the parent-teacher associations, and support of the united Protestant radio programs.
