Washington Suit Against Safeway Stores Dropped

OLYMPIA, Feb. 7.—(P)—Atty. Gen. Smith Troy said Monday the state will drop its suit charging Safeway Stores, Inc., with violation of the state unfair practices act.

The suit charging the company with selling shortening and cigars below cost was to have been heard Wednesday at Prosser.

"Although we are asking this case to be dismissed, we are in no way abandoning our project to get a real test of the law," Troy said.

He said attorneys decided at a conference Monday that the case against Safeway was "too narrow" for an effective test.

"We want one that will include everything we can think of for a

test by the supreme court," he declared.
The attorney general said the act had been held constitutional by an earlier 5-4 decision of the high court, but that case also "was not a clear cut one."
Troy said he did not know whether the new test would be brought against the Safeway company.
"But from their previous attitude, I would assume they . . . will provide the machinery for the new case immediately," he declared.
