Others Beside Fuchs In Atomic Case Is Belief

WASHINGTON, Feb. 8.—(AP)—Senator McMahon (D-Conn) hinted Tuesday that others may be involved in the case of Klaus Fuchs, the British scientist accused of giving atomic secrets to Russia. He said investigations are going on in both the United States and Britain.

The top atomic man in Congress told reporters that "further ramifications of this matter are being worked on by the FBI here and by the British intelligence service in Britain."

Asked if this meant others were involved, besides Fuchs, McMahon replied: "Some times common sense dictates arrests not be made immediately."

He declined to say whether he thought new arrests are likely. The senator also said that FBI reports show Fuchs had been "infinitely sympathetic" to Communist ideas since he was a young man.

McMahon talked with reporters after a long session of the Senate-Atomic committee with J. Edgar Hoover, chief of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. McMahon heads the committee.

He said "there can be no doubt" from the FBI's investigation that Fuchs had wide knowledge of the "so-called hydrogen bomb."

There had been reports to this effect immediately after Fuchs was arrested last Friday but shocked Congress members had clung to the hope that hydrogen bomb secrets might have escaped Fuchs.

Fuchs, a German-born scientist, held a top place in Britain's atomic enterprise. McMahon also said it was "definitely established" that the British case against Fuchs was developed from information supplied by the United States.

McMahon said he feels that definitely Fuchs gave highly secret atomic information to Russia.

New Drug For TB Undergoing Test

CLEVELAND, (AP)—Tibione—A new drug being tested against tuberculosis in 24 Veterans Administration hospitals—was described here at a meeting of 100 drug manufacturers.

Dr. Charles E. Dutches, medical director of Schenley Laboratories, Inc., discussed the drug for the research and development section of the American Drug Manufacturers' association.

He emphasized Tibione currently as being "thoroughly investigated" in this country and indicated it probably would not be available for general use before late this year.

Tibione has been tested in Western Germany, he reported, where it was used on some 10,000 tuberculosis patients since September, 1947. The drug first was developed in Germany, where it is known as Contegen. Chemically, it is 4-acetyl-amino-benzaldehydethio semicarbazone.

Tubercle bacilli which can resist tibione have not yet been detected in tests, Dr. Dutches said. The new drug is taken in doses only one-tenth the amount of streptomycin, and has been used with the latter drug in cases where streptomycin-resistant tubercle bacilli have developed, he said.

"All clinicians interviewed agreed that very prolonged treatment was desirable—perhaps six months and much longer" where tibione is employed, Dr. Dutches said.

Toy-Laden American Ship Sails Today For Europe

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 8.—(AP)—A band of American boys and girls bid bon voyage Tuesday to the American Defender and the cargo of toys the vessel is taking to Europe's children.

Also taking part in the ceremonies before the American Defender sailed for Rotterdam were 100 displaced children from Europe now living in this country.

The toys were collected in connection with the American Legion's tide of toys campaign.

George N. Craig, Legion national commander, spoke over a radio hookup during the ceremonies. Sharing the radio spotlight with Craig was Judith Ann Fay, 11-year-old Westmont, N.J., girl, who was chosen spokesman for America's 33,000,000 children.

Walter Krivacs, 13, a displaced boy from Hungary, answered for the children of Europe.

SNAKES EARN DOLLARS

JOHANNESBURG — (AP) — Snakes are big dollar-earners for South Africa, the live reptiles parts of the Union, Rhodesia and South West Africa. The live reptiles are flown from Johannesburg to United States zoos and laboratories. Orders for thousands more puff adders, mambas, and cobras worth \$8.40 each are rolling in.

It is estimated that American workers turn out goods worth an average of roughly \$1.50 for each hour work.

Senator O'Mahoney Says Businesses Go Begging For Lack Of Venture Funds

WASHINGTON—(AP)—Senator O'Mahoney (D-Wyo) says: "Businesses are going begging for lack of venture capital. The private enterprise system is starving for capital."

O'Mahoney headed a committee in December to find out how many people were hanging on to their dollars instead of investing them in corporations, or putting them out to start new businesses, and why.

When fewer people invest money fewer workers have a chance for new jobs and Uncle Sam loses the chance to collect taxes from growing business.

Many witnesses before O'Mahoney's committee said that the tax collector was taking too many of the dollars that better paid men used to have left over when they had paid the family bills.

The National City bank of New York studied the federal income taxes paid by people who earned \$25,000 or more in 1925 and 1949.

Comparatively few families have been added to the upper income brackets in the 20 years even though the national income tripled in that time, the study shows.

Further, while the national income increased three times, upper bracket incomes jumped by only about a ninth.

But the government took more than four times as much taxes from the top group in 1949, so this group took a swift plunge in what was left.

Like all the rest of us, this group was hit by another blow.

Oregon Banker Sees No Chance For Monopoly

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 8.—(AP)—An Oregon banker testified at Monday's Federal Reserve board hearing into Transamerica Corp that he knew of no way whereby anyone could obtain a banking monopoly in that state.

The witness, E. C. Sammons, is president of the U. S. National bank of Portland, largest bank in Oregon and strongest competitor of the First National Bank of Portland, of which Transamerica owns the majority stock.

The federal board has charged that Transamerica's commercial banking operations have reached a monopolistic tendency.

Sammons was called to the stand as a defense witness by Samuel B. Stewart Jr., Transamerica attorney.

Asked the direct monopoly question, Sammons replied "I know of now way by which anyone could get a monopoly. Our bank is not for sale to anyone."

Sammons added that he didn't

know how a monopoly could be obtained without his bank, as it has 40 per cent of the deposits in Oregon. Most of Stewart's questions seeking to develop the banking competition situation in Oregon resulted in objections by J. Leonard Townsend, Federal Reserve Board attorney. Rudolph M. Evans, hearing officer, sustained most of the objections. At one point Stewart expressed belief that Evans "has definitely taken sides" in the case. He said he intended to comment upon this later.
