

Strauss Resigns From Atomic Energy Board

WASHINGTON, Feb. 8. — (AP) — Lewis L. Strauss resigned Tuesday from the Atomic Energy commission with a hint that he had won a fight when President Truman ordered a go-ahead on the hydrogen super-bomb.

Strauss was generally regarded as an advocate of full speed development of the H-bomb. Just a week ago Mr. Truman told the AEC to continue its work on this and other atomic weapons.

In his letter of resignation to the President, effective April 15, Strauss pointedly said:

"The issues involving national security which were my primary concern are now resolved as I had hoped and recommended. The moment, therefore, seems appropriate to ask you to accept my resignation."

President Truman accepted the resignation effective April 15.

In a letter, made public by the White House, Strauss said he wanted to return to his private affairs "from which I have been separated for so long."

The resignation of Strauss leaves two posts to be filled by Mr. Truman on the AEC.

Chairman David E. Lilienthal, who resigned some time ago, agreed to stay on until Feb. 15 and Mr. Truman is still looking for someone to fill that vacancy.

Strauss, a former Wall Street banking house official, was the fourth member of the original

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Witness Repeats Refusal Of Offer To Kill Reuther

DETROIT, Feb. 8. — (AP) — A fellow convict has repeated in open court his statement that Carl Bolton offered him \$15,000 to kill Walter Reuther.

The testimony came from Burly John Kaliszewski, 46, star state witness in the assault-with-intent-to-kill case against Bolton.

Before a jury of eight women and six men yesterday, Kaliszewski repeated his testimony at Bolton's original examination, when the defendant was ordered held for trial.

Reuther, president of the CIO United Auto Workers, was critically wounded in a shotgun ambush attempt on his life April 20, 1948.

Under questioning by the state, Kaliszewski declared Bolton made him the \$15,000 offer three days before Reuther was wounded.

"I told Bolton," the witness said, "that \$15,000 was not enough and not to even mention the job to me or anyone else."

He said he also told Bolton: "Are you crazy—a man as big as Walter Reuther for \$15,000? Count me out."

One day before the shooting, the witness said that Bolton, a former UAW local 400 vice president, came to his apartment and received two
