Stojack had the hold the fans had been waiting for, his airplane spin, on Cummins, and it looked like the match was over, but Katonen rushed out of his corner and broke it up. Then Bell entered the ring, grabbed Katonen's arm, and applied the Jersey Whip to win the fall and match.
