Polio Is Mostly Adult's Disease; X-rays Advised

Are you concerned that your young children or young grandchildren may have tuberculosis? If you are, get a chest X-ray.

This is the advice of Mrs. W. F. Amiot, executive secretary of the Douglas County Tuberculosis and Health association. The chest X-ray survey unit opens today in two Douglas county towns.

The schedule calls for one unit to open in Roseburg at 9 a.m. and continue to 5 p.m. Monday through Tuesday, moving then to Yoncalla for a stop at the city hall from 10:30 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. and thence to Sutherlin and Piddle.

The second unit will be open at Drain Monday and Tuesday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Wednesday from 12 noon to 8 p.m. moving then to Oakland for three days, thence to Canyonville and Days Creek.

Appointments are desirable, but not necessary, and may be obtained.

ed in Roseburg by calling the Tuberculosis and Health association office, 285-J, or Mrs. William Thompson, 1033-J, and Mrs. Hugh Whipple, 2582, Drain.

Mrs. Amiot explained that the tuberculosis association is advising the adult members of the families rather than the youngsters to have the chest X-ray because tuberculosis is a communicable disease and not hereditary, and that people only get it through contact with those who have it in an active form. Practically the only contacts small children have are with members of their families or relatives.

Only a small percentage of active cases of tuberculosis found in the United States annually are among children, she said.

It is essentially a disease of persons of from 15 years and older. Despite the manner in which it has been reduced in the last 30 years, tuberculosis still takes more than 50,000 lives annually. Last year 216 persons died of tuberculosis in Ore-

gon. "Many of those deaths undoubtedly could have been prevented had the tuberculosis been found in an early stage. For this reason we urge every adult to take advantage of the opportunity of having a free chest X-ray," said Mrs. Amiot.

J. H. Bond Dates Sports Broadcast

James H. Bond, Portland, former Roseburg resident, widely known as writer, naturalist and big-game hunter, is to be heard March 2 on the Mutual network radio program, "Sports for All."

Bond, who started his career as lecturer, because of inspiration gained in showing his Yukon Territory wildlife pictures to a Roseburg audience, is currently in New York city, following recovery from a major operation.

According to reports from Bond, a brother of Theo Bond of Roseburg, he will be glad when his New York bookings are complete and he can return to his native Oregon.

He is quoted as saying that New York City "is a compound of confusion, tension, bright lights and nervous executives." He much prefers, he says, to spend his time with the moose, caribou and grizzlies of the great Northern bush, where he plans to go for the third time during the coming summer. This year's trip will take him into another of the Yukon's unexplored wilderness areas.

Dog Owners Reminded Of License Deadline

Local dog owners are advised that Wednesday, Mar. 1, is the deadline for purchasing of dog licenses.

Recorder William Bollman said that all licensees for dogs within the city should be obtained prior to that time at the city hall.

A penalty of \$1 will be charged for all dogs not licensed by the deadline. This penalty has been changed from that in effect in previous years, when the charge was 25 cents additional for each month of delay for four months. The penalty is fixed by the county court.

Unlicensed dogs may be picked up by the city and impounded. They will be disposed of, unless claimed by the owners.

Rent Office Here To Be Reactivated

The Roseburg rent office will be reactivated beginning March 1st, according to E. Daryl Mabey, area rent director. Through an arrangement with the city manager and mayor, temporary space in the city hall has been obtained and present plans call for personnel from the Portland office to assist landlords and tenants in their rent problems at least twice each month, beginning March 1st, at which time the office in the city hall will be open from 2:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. These hours have been arranged to enable persons to visit the office where it would be convenient during regular working hours. All of the workload which has accumulated since the function of the local rent office transferred to Portland is now on a current basis, the director added. Correspondence should still be addressed to Portland Office of Housing Expediter, 1008 S. W. Sixth Avenue, Portland 4, Oregon.

The local Rent Advisory Board is actively functioning in a supervisory capacity on all activities of the Roseburg office. Landlords or tenants disapproving of the decision of the federal officials may file complaints which will be considered by the board.

Planning Commission To Eye Affairs Tonight

Several items are on the slate for the monthly planning commission meeting Monday night in the city council chambers.

Items referred by the city council to the commission for study include the proposed extension of Umpqua Ave. E. to connect with Bowden Ave. and Riverside Drive; consent petitions for annexation of the property north of Taylor's addition, on which is to be located the new First Conservative Baptist church, and a petition asking for a requirement that houses built in residential class 1 districts cost at least \$4,800 and cover at least 800 square feet.

Also coming up is a request by Bob and Mary Traversa for spot zoning of their property, located at 531 Fowler street.
