Mutual-Don Lee commentator Cecil Brown (10:15 - 10:30) a. m., Mon., Wed., Fri.) who has just returned from a three-month fact-finding tour of Europe, reports that the latest, and most successful, method in Russia and Iron Curtain countries by which "confessions" are obtained is by the use of morphine. Mr. Brown, commenting on the recent Hungarian spy conviction of Robert Vogler, International Telephone and Telegraph Co. official, reported from Austrian sources that prisoners are kept incommunicado and "fed" morphine regularly ten to twelve weeks. The confessions are then wrested without difficulty by police officials. Vogler was kept a prisoner, without access to the outside world, for more than three months. 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\$25,000 Damages Sought
In Logging Accident Suit

Damages for \$25,000, plus special damages for \$9,000 are being asked by Elwin DeGrath for injuries suffered in a logging accident March 4, 1948. Wayne Kaylor and Diamond Martin, doing business as K & M Logging company, are named as defendants. The plaintiff alleges that he was ordered by the defendants to fall a tree. While doing so, a branch broke off, rendering plaintiff unconscious. Further investigation revealed plaintiff received a fractured skull, suffered concussion and other injuries, which now cause him to experience severe headaches and dizziness during warm weather, he claims. The plaintiff charges the accident was the result of alleged negligence on the part of the defendants, to provide adequate tools and observe safety precautions.

Candidacy Filing
Deadline March 10;
Registrars Given

Final date for candidates to file their nominations or for the filing for election of precinct committeemen and committeewomen in the May primaries is March 10, according to County Clerk Roy Agee.

Registration books close for voters for the primary election April 18.

Voters, to be eligible to register, must be citizens of the United States over the age of 21 years and residents of the State of Oregon at least six months.

Persons whose 21st birthday will occur after April 18, 1950, and before the primary election to be held on May 19 may register between the dates of March 20 and April 18 only. Likewise, persons whose six months' residence in the state will have been completed after April 18 and before May 19 may register between the dates of March 20 and April 18 only.

Re-registration: Voters who have moved from one precinct to another since their last registration are required to re-register in order to be eligible to vote. This does not apply where the name of the precinct has been changed and the voter has not changed his or her place of residence. In such cases, the old cards of the voters have been placed in the new precinct and no further registration is necessary. Voters may check with the county clerk, if they desire, to be sure their cards are in the proper precinct.

Women who have married and changed surnames must re-register in order to be eligible to vote. Persons who wish to change party affiliation must re-register in order to effect the change.

"Tick's" Tips On
Veterans Hospital

A state of orderly, good natured confusion; elevators jammed to the roofs, clothing ladies on the march, double time, attendants, nurses and doctors running through routine; everyone hitting the ball, so to speak, Thursday and Friday of this week at the Veterans' hospital. Down to Floyd Powell's office went this reporter. What gives? Powell, assistant manager, says this is it: "A great deal of study is being devoted by the hospital staff for the safety of the patients in the event of a catastrophe or perhaps fire. Complete plans are being formulated for the evacuation of patients and personnel in any contingency. All employees of the hospital are being assigned to the working units to go into action immediately upon notification by siren or telephone.

"While this subject has always been one of great concern to the Veterans administration, hospital fires in recent years have brought the matter to a priority status. "To provide greater safety for patients, the surgical cases who have in the past occupied the fifth floor, and who usually are non-ambulatory have been moved to the ground floor or ward one. The former patients of ward one have been moved to ward 5 and are in most instances able to use the stairs, thus are much easier than bed patients to evacuate from the fifth floor since stretchers would not be required.

"The hospital staff is ever alert to possible fires and everyone (patients and employees) are continually cautioned to exercise care in disposing of matches, cigarettes, rubbish or inflammable material of whatever nature."
