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Bishop Sherrill To Broadcast On Overseas Relief

The final program of a six-day series on "Operation Good Samaritan" will be heard Saturday from 4:45 p.m. with the airing of "My Name on a Mailbox" to be heard over station KRNR.

This 15-minute dramatization of the immigration program of displaced persons and their resettlement in the United States completes a week of preparation for a mass collection to be taken this Sunday in 100,000 Protestant and Eastern Orthodox churches throughout the nation.

The appeal is intended to secure funds with which to further the overseas relief work through denominational and interdenominational relief agencies. This united relief program, culminating Sunday in the "One Great Hour of Sharing," will reach nearly 25,000,000 members of the 19 cooperating church denominations.

As a part of the final proceedings Sunday, the Episcopal church presiding bishop, the Most Rev. Henry Knox Sherrill, will be heard on a nationwide hook-up. He will be heard locally over KRNR at 6:45 p.m., Sunday. An article appearing in Thursday's News-Review reported the time of the broadcast as 11:30 a.m., based on original information.

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Mercy Killer's Friends Raising Money For Defense

ALLENTOWN, Pa., March 11.—(AP)—Friends of Harold Mohr, confessed mercy slayer of his blind, cancer-ridden brother, are raising a fund for his legal defense.

Contributions already have been pledged by some employees of the Van-Dye-way Corp., Coplay, Pa., tannery where Mohr formerly was employed.

Richard Dressel, warden at the Lehigh county prison, said Mohr "is a willing and cooperative prisoner," and seems unperturbed.

Mohr was returned to the prison after he gave district attorney Kenneth H. Koch the story of how last Tuesday night he shot his brother, Walter, 35, in the bedroom of their home at Coplay, five miles north of Allentown.

Koch quoted Harold as saying he pressed the trigger of a .30 caliber hunting rifle after Walter, lying in bed, said, "Go ahead."

Walter, blind for 15 years, suffered from a cancer which had spread over his face.

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
