A former Japanese prisoner of war, missionary J. W. Pattee will tell of his experiences in a service at the Roseburg Church of the Nazarene Saturday evening at 7:30.

Pattee plans to show movies of mission work in the Far East, as well as projected slides of Chinese scenes photographed during his nine years in that country.

During his stay in China, the missionary saw five years of fighting between the Japanese and Chinese. He was in the midst of battle three times, he says.

Plotting-To-Rid-Husband Case Appears To Be Out

BREMERTON, March 14.—(AP)—Court action against Mrs. Wilford Platt, a Bremerton housewife who confessed to police last fall of plotting to do away with her husband, appears shelved for good.

The state supreme court has dismissed an appeal by the state from Kitsap Superior Judge H. G. Sutton's dismissal of charges against the woman. The high court action was taken because the appellants failed to follow through after filing appeal papers.

Judge Sutton last November threw charges of "plotting" out of court with the ruling that is constituted no crime.

Mrs. Platt has since rejoined her husband and two children.

Charges of forgery brought against the wife for the sale of the family automobile are still resting in court containers. Kitsap county officials said there would probably be no action on these unless her husband, Wilford Platt, presses the charges.

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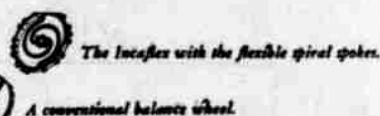


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
