An award of one academic year of study at the University of New Zealand came as a "complete surprise" to Roseburg's 4-H club agent, Frank von Borstel Jr.

"I applied for study under the Fulbright act back in November of last year," Von Borstel said. "Then I forgot about it until last Monday, when a letter from the airlines company notified me of my reservations to Auckland, N. Z."

This "unofficial" notice was soon followed by a letter from the state department telling him of his selection as an American student to attend a foreign college.

Under the act bearing the name

of Arkansas Senator J. W. Fulbright, von Borstel will be one of a very few American students to study abroad. The act was set up to enable foreign lands to purchase

Based on figures from the National Industrial Conference Board and the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the chart gives NIB's estimate of 900,000 non-farm dwellings for 1950. Some builders predict, however, that 1950 home building may exceed that of 1949. In relation to population and the number of new families formed during the year, the peak building figure for 1925 represented a greater boom than 1949's million units.

equipment and materiel left behind when American forces returned to the States after the war. Purpose of the program, as outlined by Sen. Fulbright, was to "broaden international understanding and deal with the dollar shortage." All traveling, educational and living expenses which von Borstel will incur will be paid by the dominion of New Zealand. The act also sponsors travel and study in this country for foreign students.

A flight of 28 or 29 hours is all that is required for von Borstel to reach the New Zealand airport. His schedule reads: Leave Medford March 22, leave San Francisco March 24 and arrive at Auckland March 25 via Honolulu, Canton islands, and Fiji islands. He is scheduled to report to the American embassy in Wellington on arrival.
