

Death Benefits Asked By Kin

Relatives of Elmer J. Fenton, electrocuted when he came in contact with a live wire while working for John T. Beck last September, filed suit in circuit court Friday to collect death benefits under the Workmen's compensation law.

Ella Mae Fenton, Elmer J. Fenton, Michael Terrance Fenton and Gregory Lee Fenton ask that their claim for compensation be referred back to the defendant, State Industrial accident commission for modification.

The defendant alleges the plaintiffs are not covered under the law.

Dan R. Elliott and Grant Metterlich, partners, doing business as Elliott Motors, filed suit in circuit court demanding judgment for \$332.89, plus interest and costs, against A. W. Hendricks and Basil Don Hendricks, partners doing business as Hendricks Mill and Lumber Co.

The plaintiffs allege that a check issued by the defendants for work performed by the plaintiffs was dishonored, upon presentation to a bank, for lack of funds.

Credit Bureau Adjustment department filed suit in circuit court Friday against Amos Shadley, demanding judgment for \$313.10, plus interest and costs, alleged due on an assigned account.

General Credit Service, Inc. filed suit against C. F. Reason and T. C. Smith, doing business as Roseburg Plumbing and Supply, demanding judgment for \$332.84, plus interest and costs, alleged due on an assigned account.

International Mysteries Faced By French Police

PARIS, March 17.—(AP)—French security police grappled today with three separate mysteries of possible international intrigue, including the death of a man found carrying British intelligence service envelopes.

The body of a man found by railroad tracks near Metz in eastern France yesterday was identified as Emile Stemmler, born in Neusatz, Germany, a naturalized British citizen since March 23, 1939.

Envelopes of the British intelligence service were found in the luggage by his body, police said. Death was due to a skull fracture.

At the Franco-Belgian border yesterday police arrested four Czechoslovakian and Yugoslav citizens.

Police said that Stemmler was 31 years old, and that because of this they learned to the theory he might not have been a secret agent on active service. He had a ticket to Strasbourg, and a passport valid for all European nations. They speculated he fell or jumped from the Metz-Strasbourg train.

At Mulhouse, also in eastern France, police were trying to learn the real identity of a young German girl arrested recently while trying to enter Switzerland secretly. She had given the name of Ingrid Von Buelow, and said her father was a general Von Buelow, jailed in Holland. Dutch police have advised the French this is not true.
