FAIR OAKS H. E. CLUB HOLDS ALL-DAY SESSION

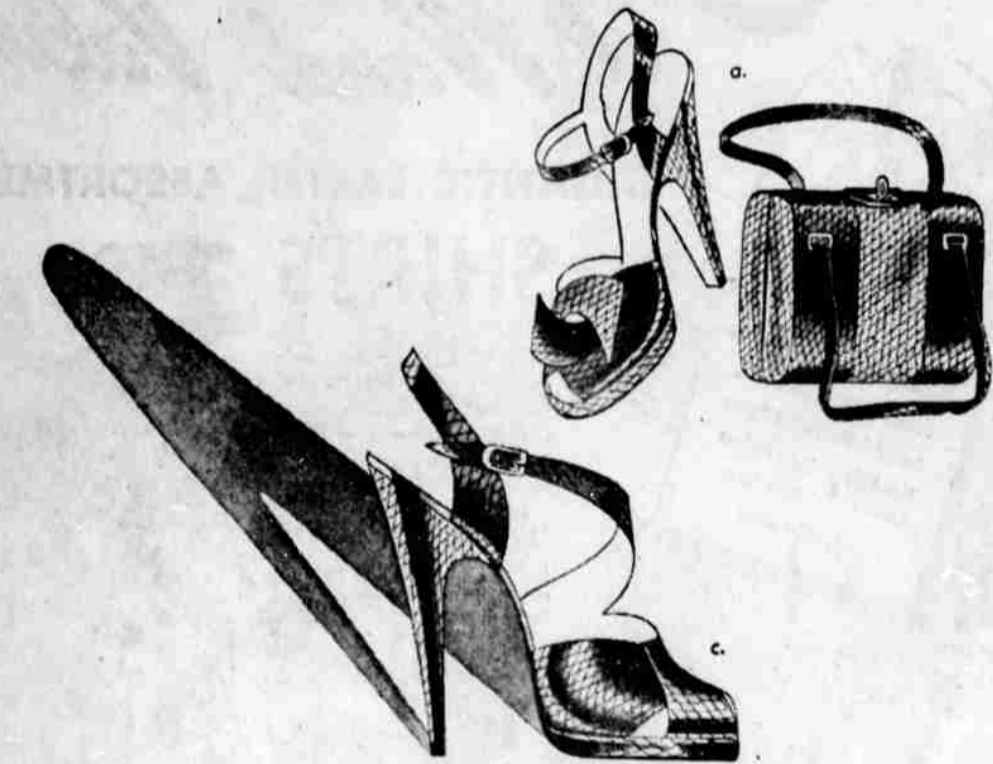

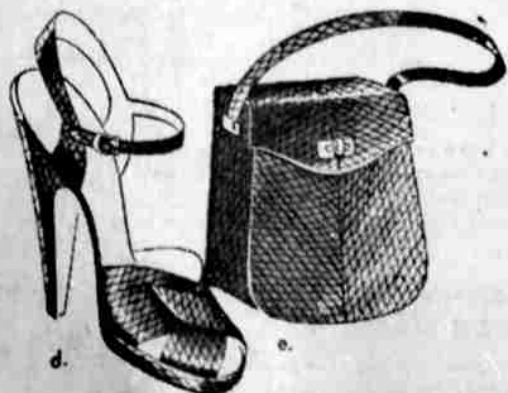
