Old-Age Pension Confused With Social Security

Confusion exists in the minds of many people between old-age assistance, commonly called the old-age pension, and old-age and survivors insurance, according to Paul F. Johnson, manager of the local office of the Social Security administration at Eugene.

"There is a basic difference that should be understood," said Johnson. "Public assistance payments, including old-age assistance, are made to needy persons because of their need. The payments have no relation to the work they have done or to tax deductions from their earnings."

"Old-age and survivors insurance is strictly a contributory insurance system. Under it the worker pays for his own retirement benefits, or death benefits for his family, by paying in a small premium, or tax deduction, every pay day. Benefits are paid without regard to the amount of the family's savings or property. Being a federal program it is uniform throughout the United States."

"If the insurance benefit isn't enough, it can sometimes be supplemented by public assistance. The worker should first investigate his rights under old-age and survivors insurance by contacting his local Federal Security office. For public assistance he should call at the nearest office of Public Welfare, administered by the state or county in which he lives."

A representative of the Social Security administration will be at the city hall in Roseburg Tuesday, April 4, from 8:30 a. m. to noon, to assist local residents in filing claims for OASI benefits or obtaining information about the program.

Russian Planes, Troops In China

HONG KONG, April 1. — (AP) — Soviet air crews have been flying patrols over north China sea routes for the past four days, American shipping representatives radioed today.

The reports from north China said the Russian aircraft were patrol planes or bombers, possibly Ilyushins.

"The identification is rather sweeping, since Russian Ilyushins include everything from up to date four-jet bombers to conventional two-engine assault bombers, transports and Stormovik fighters."

The reports were received by a Hong Kong shipping agency from American shipping representatives in north China cities and a former American merchant ship which left Tientsin in the past 48 hours.

The reports said Russian airman, anti-aircraft crews and garrison troops are swarming into the north China ports of Tsingtao, Tientsin and Dairen.

Garrison troops "by the hundred" are walking the streets of these cities wearing Russian military uniforms, the reports said.

Walnut Imports From China Draw Complaint

WASHINGTON, April 1. — (AP) — Rep. Norblad (R-Ore) has urged the State Department to stop the importation into the United States of shelled walnuts from Communist China.

He made public a letter to Secretary of State Acheson saying that Chinese walnuts are selling at from 40 to 42 cents a pound, or 20 cents under the price for comparable grades of American walnuts.

"It appears to me to be an intolerable situation when shipments from Communist-held China are brought into the United States with little or no restriction," Norblad said.

New Superintendent For Naval Academy Named

WASHINGTON, April 1. — (AP) — Vice Admiral Harry W. Hill will become superintendent of the naval academy at Annapolis, Md., on April 28. He will relieve Rear Admiral James L. Holloway Jr., who has been named commander of the Atlantic fleet crusader force.

Hill has recently been chairman of the navy general board. With the Atlantic fleet, Holloway will replace Rear Admiral Allen E. Smith who has been named commandant of the 13th naval district with headquarters at Seattle.
