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Marshall Plan Hurts Northwest, Angell Says

WASHINGTON, April 1. — (AP) — Rep. Angell (R-Ore) told the House that a result of the economic cooperative program "is to liquidate Northwest industries in favor of building up the Marshall plan countries."

He said the program permitted products produced in those foreign countries to undermine American industries.

"As a result the export trade for lumber and flour has already been liquidated with thousands of workmen being thrown out of employment and ultimately some of these industries will collapse if this program is continued," Angell said. "The administration has authority under existing laws to protect these American producers but refuses to do so."

National N. W. Forests Popular As Playgrounds

More than 10 million people made use of the recreational resources of the 19 national forests in Oregon and Washington in 1949. H. J. Andrews, regional forester for the Pacific Northwest region of the U. S. Forest Service reports from his Portland office that the recreational use increased 10 percent over 1948.

Nation-wide recreational use of the national forests reached an all-time record of 26 million visits. Use of winter sports areas slumped 25 percent during 1949. This was caused by the severe winter and difficult traveling conditions.

Ten and three-quarter million persons averaged one-half day in the Pacific Northwest's national forests according to Andrews. Of these, 1 1/4 million visitors spent a total of 2 1/4 million days camping and picnicking. These are the most popular forms of recreational use in the national forests. The 1949 estimate of camping shows an increase of 26 percent over the previous year. Winter sports, the next most popular recreational activity, attracted over 400,000 visitors. Resort guests numbered 248,000, summer homes 48,800 and organization camps 37,000. Of the remainder, 7 1/4 million persons averaged one-fourth day in passing through the forests on sight-seeing and business trips.

National forest recreational improvements, largely constructed during the days of the civilian conservation corps, are rapidly deteriorating due to a shortage of recreational improvement funds. Andrews stated forest service funds are not adequate to replace these time-worn and greatly enjoyed improvements. He also pointed out that every effort possible is expended to keep them in the best usable condition.

Estimates of forest visitors are gathered by rangers and forest guards, and while not based on complete counts, they show the extent to which our great out-of-doors is enjoyed.
