Damages Demanded For Loss Of Home By Fire

A suit to collect \$4,800 damages was filed Tuesday in circuit court against Claude Kellum, by W. H. and Edith Dameswood and the New Hampshire Fire Insurance Co.

The complaint alleges that Kellum is responsible for the destruction by fire of the plaintiff's home. According to the complaint, the defendant "carelessly" allowed a fire, which was burning slash and debris on the property adjacent to the plaintiff's property, to spread to the adjoining land of the plaintiff's, causing the dwelling, together with household furniture, to become destroyed.

'World Citizen' Returns To U. S.

NEW YORK, April 5. — (AP) — After a four-day detention on Ellis island, "world citizen" Garry Davis was back on his native soil today, pleading for rest and privacy.

The 28-year-old air force veteran, who spent the last two years in France crusading for world government, told newsmen on his release by immigration authorities yesterday:

"Let me slip into oblivion. I really do not have anything to say. I'm not a private person. I'm not seeking publicity, in fact, I think there has been entirely too much publicity."

As he stepped ashore, Davis was met by his father, handleader Meyer Davis, and his 19-year-old sister, Marjorie.

Young Davis gave up his U. S. citizenship in Paris two years ago to become what he called "world citizen No. 1."

He returned to the U. S. last Thursday on an immigrant's visa that would permit him to apply for citizenship after meeting the usual residential requirements. However, he says he intends to remain stateless.

Medford Lumber Firm Sues Union Over Picketing

MEDFORD, April 5 — (AP) — A \$100,000 damage suit was filed Monday by the Kogap lumber industries, Medford, against a union group which the firm charges with illegal picketing.

The firm's complaint, names as defendants the Medford Building and Construction Trades council, AFL, and local unions, officers and members.

It seeks an injunction against picketing and asks \$25,000 as actual damages and \$75,000 as punitive and exemplary damages.

The company, some time ago used some of its production employees in constructing a dry kiln and lumber shed. Those employees are represented by the AFL Lumber and Sawmill workers union.

The council posted pickets in mid-February.

The company, whose name was made up from the slogan "Keep Oregon Green and Productive," is engaged in logging and lumbering. Its president is S. V. McQueen.
