



### Kellogg Missionary To Assist In Modernizing Irish Castle Donated By Rich Woman For Use As Orphanage

Ever try to re-model a castle—one without electricity or any of the other modern conveniences most of us take for granted? That's the job facing Robert C. Minter of Kellogg, who leaves soon for Ireland and an "old country" estate. As a part of his work with the European Christian Orphanage Missionary society, Minter will help modernize the castle, given by a very rich Irish lady to be used as an orphanage.

Mr. and Mrs. Minter, the former Maybelle Holcomb, also of Kellogg, are now in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada, with their two young sons. Minter will fly to Ireland to attend to legal matters pertaining to the estate. He will be joined early in June by his family.

Minter first became interested in Christian missionary teaching while attending Cascade college in Portland. He completed his Christian training there recently and made plans to undertake this type of work. Prior to his training at

the Portland college, Minter served in the army of occupation in Japan and attended the University of Oregon one year.

Minter is the son of Robert D. Minter of Kellogg and Mrs. Minter is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. V. K. Holcomb, also of Kellogg. Young Minter was graduated from Oakland high school in 1940 and his wife is a graduate of Elkton high school the same year.

The Minters' address after May 25 will be Shan Creggan Estate, Ballybafey, County of Donegal, Eire.
