# Hindu-Moslem Peace Boosted

NEW DELHI, India, April 8—49;
—India and Pakistan concluded an agreement today aimed at putting an end to bitter strife between Hindus and Moslems in the two countries. A communique announcing the

agreement was issued an hour after Pakistan's prime minister, Liaquat Ali Khan, departed for his own capital at Karachi. The agreement capital at Karachi. The agreement resulted from seven days of dis-classions between Liaquat and In-dia's Prime Minister Jawaharlal Pandit Nehru.
