### Ex-Official Slated As Defense Attorney

ANCHORAGE, Alaska.—(P)—Thurman W. Arnold, former head of the government's anti-trust division, is scheduled to represent the Alaska Steamship Co., before a federal grand jury here, the Anchorage Times reports.

The steamship line is one of nearly 200 firms being investigated by the jury to determine whether any shall be indicted for violations of the Sherman anti-trust act.
