The Western International league club's triumph evened its two-game series with the collegians.

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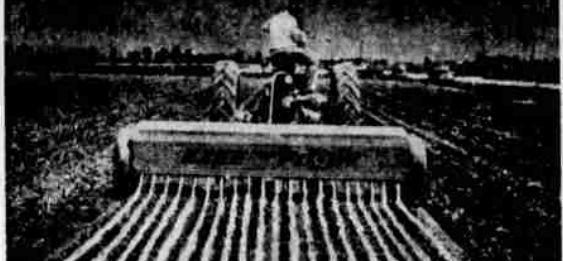
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Drain Warriors Top Elmira, 8-4

New Engine To Up Speed, Range Of Fastest Bomber

WASHINGTON, (P)—The air force has disclosed it has contracted to build a four-engine version of the world's fastest bomber, the Boeing B-47 stratojet, to increase both range and speed.

The B-47 was designed as a six-engine plane with 18 rocket motors to give it extra push on takeoff or in emergencies. The reduction to four engines is made possible by more than doubling the available power in each engine over that produced in the original models.

Disclosure of the project to modify one B-47B (the model now in production at Boeing's Wichita, Kas., plant) was made in the monthly report of the air materiel command. The report put the cost at \$4,122,427.

The new engines are the J-35-A23 built by Allison division of General Motors corporation at Indianapolis, Ind. They have been reported unofficially to have a total thrust of 9,200 pounds—the highest announced for any jet motor.

The original J-35s in the B-47s were rated at 4,000 pounds thrust. A more powerful engine has been installed in the B-47B and the gross takeoff weight has been increased from about 125,000 pounds to 190,000 pounds.

The result has been to increase the straight-line range of the plane from around 2,200 miles to around 4,000. The new type to be built, to be known as the B-47C, will have still more range. It is expected to carry external fuel tanks on the outer racks now used to carry jet engines.

The B-47 originally was designed and built at Boeing's Seattle Wash. plant. It has sharply swept wings and tail, giving it an arrow appearance in flight. An experimental model flew from Seattle at an average speed of 607 miles an hour a year ago.
