His death, which came after a three-week illness, followed by less than two weeks that of the Most Rev. Leo Fabian Faber, bishop coadjutor of the Roman Catholic Baker City diocese.

Bishop McGrath was installed bishop in the Cathedral of St. Francis De Sales here on April 1, 1919. He was a native of Ireland.
