

### Soviet Isolation Plan Will Meet Big 3 Resistance

(By The Associated Press)  
Big three western foreign ministers in their forthcoming London conference will face the problem of Russian relations amidst mounting evidence that the Communist world seeks isolation to a degree hitherto unknown.

Washington observers said the talks among the foreign minister of the United States, Britain and France will tighten cooperation of the western bloc nations but will be largely influenced by these cold war tensions:

1. The American-Soviet dispute over the loss of an American plane in the Baltic and the fear that Russia aims to close the Baltic and border areas to foreign observation.
2. The ousting of western diplomats and news correspondent from Soviet-bloc countries amidst mounting evidence the Kremlin aims at shutting the west out of its territories almost completely.

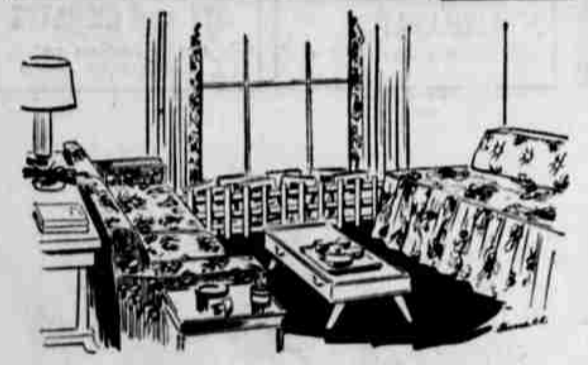
The conference will work out a global plan to meet the threat of Communist expansion. It will attempt to outline a three-power policy for Germany, a plan for the political and economic integration of western Europe, and will discuss a Japanese peace treaty. It will also consider pressing problems in Southwest Asia and the Middle-East.

### City Hall Eyesore, V. J. Micelli Says At Rotary Meet

Pointing out the need for some thinking about local clearance problems, Victor J. Micelli told fellow Rotarians at the Hotel Umpqua Thursday, "It is a disgrace for a city the size of Roseburg to have an eyesore like the city hall building." It was condemned about 40 years ago, he recalled.

Clearance problems was one of four points put forth by Micelli at the regular Thursday noon meeting of Rotary calling attention to things the club can do as community services.

In connection with his remarks about the city hall, he pointed out the need for adequate office space for local officials. Considering other things which he said need "survey" and "investigating" action, Micelli urged consideration of a water conservation program for the South Umpqua basin.

"The area will become a desert like other parts of Oregon, if something isn't done," he said. "Present conditions can mean the death of agricultural life" in that section.

Although many other organizations and agencies are directly involved in carrying out service projects, his club could be the "investigators" and "promoters" of such things as a soil erosion study and long-range community planning, Micelli stated.

Rotarians, as a club, can cooperate with the support organizations which have objectives for improving the community. It will "require a genuine interest in the welfare of other people in the community," he said, but this expression in action of the ideal of service must be made "in personal, business and community life."

Rotarians, as business men, are morally obligated to do this, he maintained, emphasizing that "we must be a service club, not just a knife and fork club."

Micelli went on to say how important it was for each member to participate in any activity for community service which the club may undertake. "It's nice to have the knowledge that your attendance at meetings is worthwhile," he added.

"Moral support is not enough," the speaker told the members. The club must have service activities requiring the participation of all its members.

It takes hard work and a lot of money to do some things, Micelli concluded, but cooperative action can work miracles.

President Leroy Hiatt introduced the speaker. He announced that Micelli has been called upon to speak on "club service" at the coming district convention at Astoria, May 7, 8, 9 and 10.

Earlier in the program, Bill Van Horn, student Rotarian, introduced the senior high school "German band." The band publicized the school band's concert Thursday night by playing three selections. Clarinetist Frank Olson announced the numbers, which were received with much applause.

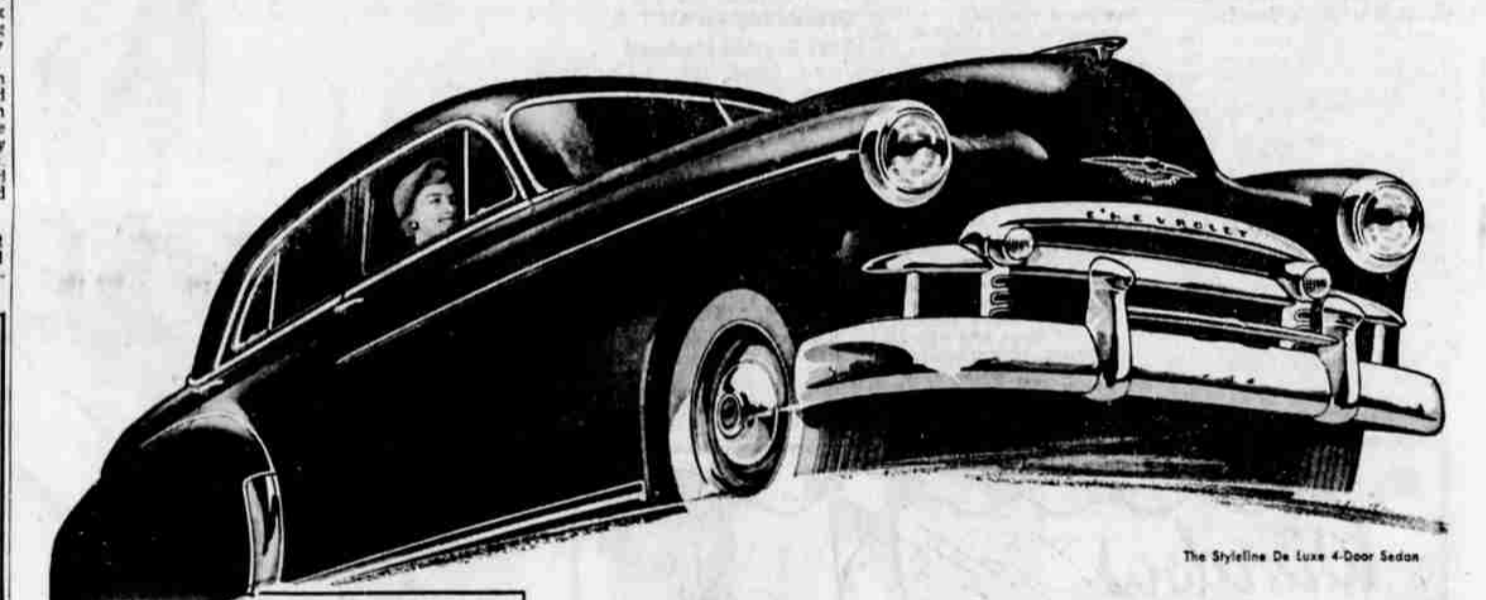
