**Union Accepts Pension
Offer of Weyerhaeusers**

LONGVIEW, April 22.—(P)—
Agreement between the Weyer-
haeuser Timber company and AFL
plywood workers local No. 2498
was announced here Friday.

The union accepted the com-
pany's pension offer at the same
time a new labor agreement was
signed. The contract is essentially
the same as that already in exist-
ence.

The WTC pension plan is based
on length of service, with the firm
putting a specified amount in cash
into a fund under an impartial trust-
ee. The amount is sufficient to
guarantee lifetime pensions for the
men on retirement, union officials
said. Average amount of the pen-
sion payment is estimated at slight-
ly more than \$100 per month.

**Hitler's Birthday Given
No Notice in Germany**

BERLIN, April 21.—(P)—Adolf
Hitler's 61st birthday came and
went yesterday without a single
"Seig Heil."

But many Germans still believe
the fuhrer is alive, despite the
official version that he committed
suicide when the Russians over-
ran Berlin.

Some hold Hitler was all right
but suffered from bad advice.
A dozen Germans picked at Ran-
dom from different walks of life
demonstrated these conclusions.
Here are some typical opinions:
Frau Hilda, who has two daugh-
ters working in the Soviet zone:
"Hitler is in Spain. And anyhow
he was better than what we have
now."

A 72-year-old gardener from Sax-
ony: "Let the poor devil rest. He
didn't know until the last minute
what was happening."

**'Hot Potato' For Soviet
Predicted By Official**

ANN ARBOR, MICH., April 22
—(P)—Russia may soon get "a
new hot potato of considerable di-
mensions," says a U. S. State de-
partment expert.

Francis H. Russell, director of
the office of public affairs, dropped

the hint of moves to come in an
address here last night at the Uni-
versity of Michigan.

He said he was referring to a
"program of technical aid to the
world's underdeveloped areas,"
planned by this country and other
free nations.

"The police states are going to
find themselves more and more
on the defensive," he predicted.
