**DOUGLAS COUNTY SENDS NUMBER OF DELEGATES TO OREGON PTA CONGRESS**

"Human Beginnings," for use in kindergarten, first and second grade levels, will be presented by Curtis Avery. The second film "Preface to Life," produced by the National Mental Health association, will be shown by Melvin L. Murphy. This latter film has not been previewed in Oregon before.

A panel discussion is scheduled following the showing of the films with Dr. Henry Gunn, president of the Oregon College of Education as moderator. General discussion will take place following the panel.
