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Administration Called Modern 'Robin Hood'

WASHINGTON —(AP)— A Young Republican leader has described the Truman administration as a modern-day Robin Hood which steals from the rich, keeps a big helping for itself, and gives the rest to the poor.

In an address before the National Society of Children of the American Revolution, John Tope, chairman of the Young Republican National Federation, said:

"I am sure you all remember the story of Robin Hood, the outlaw who always robbed the rich, kept a big portion for himself, and then distributed the rest of his loot to the poor.

"Well, that is the kind of program which our present government officials are trying to give you and me today."

Charging that the "Robin Hoods in our country" believe in "taking from the industrious, and the encouragement of laziness," Tope added:

"They don't hesitate to use force to gain their point and to control their followers through fear. Political gang killings are not out of the ordinary, but they don't use bows and arrows."

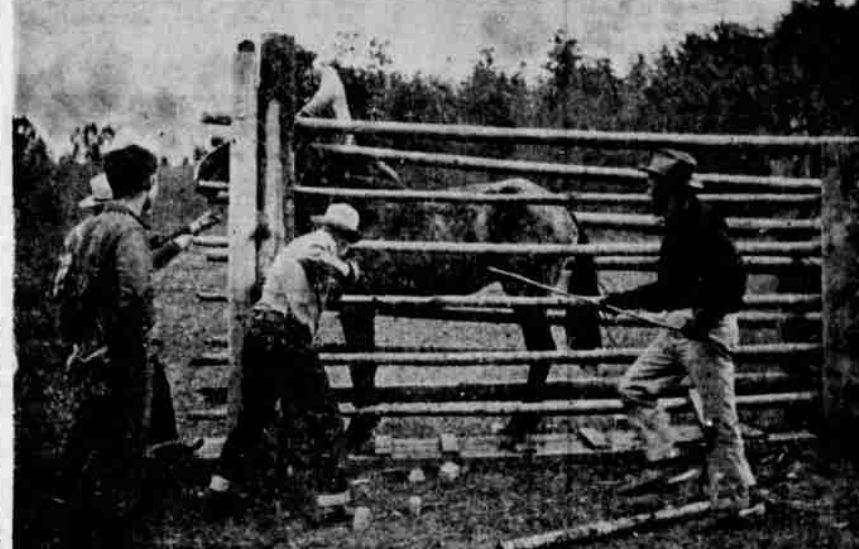
This apparently was an allusion to the April 8 slaying of Charlie Binaggio, a Kansas city political figure, and his bodyguard, Rep. Short (R-Mo) said in the House that Binaggio was "bumped off" because he opposed a U.S. Senate candidate backed by President Truman.

Tope said the present struggle between this country and Russia "is a war of diplomacy and economic forces" which young people will have to pay for out of their future earnings.

If "the forces of liberty" are not successful in this struggle, he said, "then we young people will have to pay the bill . . . not only in terms of cash, but in terms of blood, scars and suffering."

The Young Republican leader urged his listeners to prepare for "the most perilous battle in our history" by "active participation in politics in the party of your choice."

The total is 27,546 pounds of milk, containing 1,172.6 pounds of butterfat. 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Oregon Prison Fugitive Found After 34 Years

SOMERVILLE, N. J. —(AP)— A weary, bedraggled old man sat in a jail cell today awaiting his return to the Oregon state prison after 34 flight-filled years of freedom.

Twelve days ago, state police said, 63-year-old Louis Strof was picked up as just another vagrant. He was huddled in two overcoats, his worldly goods tied in a bandana handkerchief.

He told arresting officers he was on his way to New York to see the sights. The little bald-headed man seemed harmless enough but he was sent to the Somerset county jail for 10 days, more for a place to sleep than anything else, police said.

Strof's fingerprints were sent to Washington as a matter of routine. Thursday they came back.

The little man was wanted in Oregon, state police said. He had escaped from the state prison in 1916 after serving two-and-a-half years of a six-to-ten year sentence for shooting a special policeman, police records showed.

Strof told his story to trooper Paul Bellocchio, one of his arresting officers.

Strof said he used many aliases and never carried any identification for fear of being found out. For those 34 long years of freedom, Strof roamed about the country from one city to another.

He hitchhiked rides and rode the rails supporting himself from what food and money he could get from begging. He said he never took a job, fearing his background would be checked.

In prison, Strof said, he was made a trustee and escaped simply by "walking away."

Detainers have been filed by Oregon authorities for Strof. Any day now, Bellocchio said, he expected to meet an officer from that state there to pick up Strof.

SALEM. —(AP)—Prison warden George Alexander said he would send a man east to pick up two escaped Oregon penitentiary convicts.

One of them, Louis Strof, 63, walked away from the prison in 1917. He is being held at Somerville, N. J.

The other is Kenneth Clark, Jackson county check forger, who walked away from the prison farm in August, 1946, after serving five months of a three-year sentence. Alexander said he would send for the two men as soon as arrangements can be made to extradite Clark, who refused to waive extradition.

He said the federal bureau of investigation advised him of Clark's capture.
