Airmen Advised To File Flight Plans Before Hop

SEATTLE — (AP) — High-flying Pacific Northwest airmen may save themselves the problem of identifying themselves in flight after May 5 to military aircraft if they file flight plans before they take off.

On that date a roughly oblong slice of Washington, Oregon, Idaho and Montana will become the nation's third air defense area. Similar programs have been set up in northeastern United States and at Los Alamos, N.M.

Only planes flying above 10,000 feet above sea level or 4,000 feet over terrain, which is highest, are affected. This will eliminate the large bulk of pleasure craft or student pilots in the region.

The area involved ranges from a point 23 miles at sea due west of the Canadian border, southward to a point opposite North Bend, Ore. From there the line goes east to Ontario, Ore., northeast to Superior, Mont., north to Canada and west to the original point.

Still off-limits completely is the Hanford atomic plant area in south central Washington.

Filing of flight plans will be compulsory under the defense area set-up, Bedinger said. But he added: "It will save waste effort by military aircraft."

Nudists Less Problem Than Dogs in Census Job

SEATTLE — (AP) — "Enumerated nudist camp. Oooh-is-la!" Read the King county crew leader's census report.

But the crew leader, Jack Speer of North Bend, confessed the job wasn't as interesting as he made it sound. There was only a caretaker at the nudist camp near Issaquah when he visited it, Speer explained.

Speer reported to James L. Rondeau, district supervisor at Tacoma, that nudists presented less of a problem than savage dogs guarding some isolated dwellings in the area between Lake Sammamish and the Cascade summit.

Speer said the dogs prevented women enumerators from approaching and he planned to undertake the task himself.

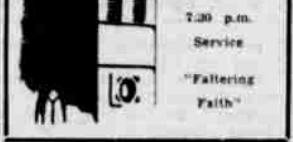
