

# Riverside, Rose Win Over Fullerton, Benson Trackmen

The second series of city grade school track meets was run Saturday on Finlay field with Riverside defeating Fullerton 143 1/2 to 124 5/8 and Rose downing Benson 170 2/3 to 97 1/3.

A new city grade school record was set in the high jump with Gray of Rose jumping 4 feet 1 in. The meet between Rose and Benson resulted in one track oddity. The Rose and Benson shuttle relay teams tied for first place honors.

Saturday's meet was originally scheduled for May 6 but was moved ahead because it conflicted with the county B league meet which will be held on Finlay field Saturday.

The next regularly scheduled meet will be May 20 with the grade school athletes from Riverside competing with Fullerton and Benson running against Rose.

## Cummings Retains Coast Mat Title

 Bulldog Bob Cummings retained his Pacific coast junior lightweight title at the armory Saturday night as he defeated Gordon Hessel, popular challenger.

In the opener, Eddie Williams won over Jack O'Reilly via the two-out-of-three fall route.

Hessel won the first fall in 19:13 with his famous "trigger hold" after taking much punishment from a hammerlock by Cummings. Hessel suddenly whirled around, and surprising everyone, clamped on the hold to take the fall.

Cummings started working on the thigh of Hessel's leg in the second fall, hitting Hessel there with his knee and foot until Hessel's leg seemed to be awfully sore. Then Cummings clamped on a leg leverage lock and won the fall with a series of leg stomps.

In the surprisingly fast last fall, Cummings went right to work on Hessel's leg, and after about two holds, he got the leg leverage lock again and won the final fall with leg stomps.

O'Reilly started out fast in the opener by taking the first fall with his punishing hammerlock in 19:07, but Williams came back to win the next two, and the match. He took the second fall with an abdominal stretch after cleverly getting out of O'Reilly's hammerlock. In the third fall, O'Reilly started a slugging match, and seemed to have Williams on the ropes. Then suddenly Williams came to life, grabbed both of O'Reilly's legs, and took the fall with a flying dutchman.
