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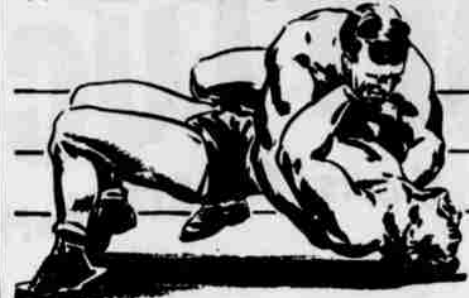

National Hospital day will be observed at the Roseburg Veterans Administration hospital Sunday, May 14, from 1 to 4 p.m., with guided tours through the hospital being the main feature of the day. National Hospital day is always observed on the Sunday closest to the birthday of Florence Nightingale, which falls on May 12. For each of the past several years between 400 and 500 people make the tour of the hospital on this special occasion.
