Indian Junior Varsity Trackmen Win Three-Way Meet On Finlay Field Oval

The Roseburg high school junior varsity track team took nine first place honors, collecting 73½ points to win a three-way track meet with Canyonville and the junior high school on Finlay field Tuesday.

The Roseburg junior high school track team placed second in the meet with 47½ points and Canyonville collected 30 points for third place. Jim Kemp of the Paposes won the broad jump, 220 yard dash and ran on the winning 880 yard relay team to take the high individual scoring honors with 11 points. Allen Winter of the junior varsity was runner up in the individual scoring by taking first place in the shot put and javelin throw. Hoffee was the only Canyonville trackman to take a first place and that was in the 100 yard dash event.

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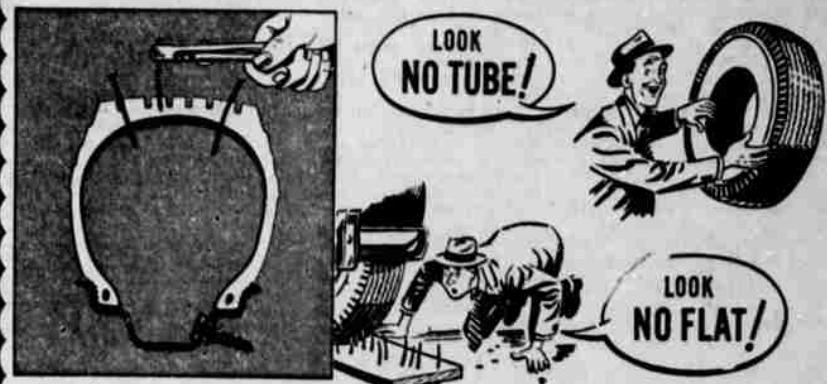
