WASHINGTON—(AP)—Veterans who want to go to summer school under the GI bill should start making the arrangements now, the Veterans administration said.

The agency said in a statement that veterans should first find out whether their VA certificates of eligibility are in order. Those planning to change their courses should learn from VA whether they must undergo advisement and guidance.

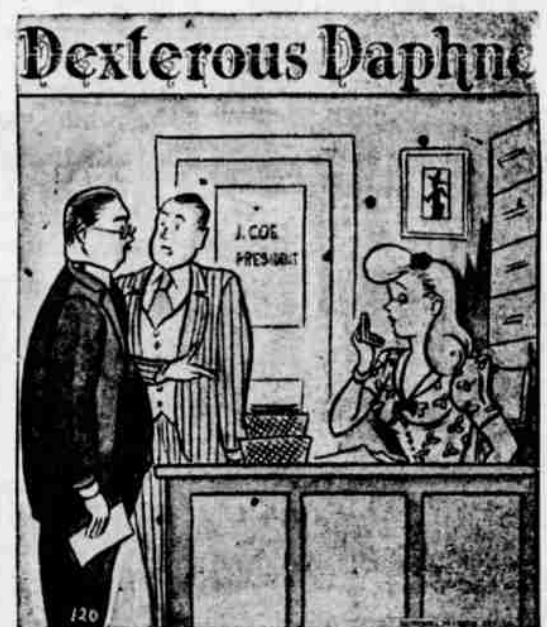
