Appropriations For State Activities Increased

SALEM, May 6.—(P)—The State department of agriculture and state fair got increased appropriations Friday from the state emergency board.

The board authorized the department to spend \$1,972,676 for the two-year budget period ending July 1, 1951, or \$346,269 more than the legislature authorized.

The state fair got permission to spend \$662,844, or \$41,705 more than the legislature authorized.

The state education agency for surplus property won permission to spend \$176,233 in addition to the \$116,225 authorized by the legislature. The state liquor commission was permitted to spend \$63,000 more than the \$108,855 which the legislature approved for new construction.

All of those authorizations for extra spending will come from the fees collected by the departments.

The emergency board gave \$22,000 of its own funds to the state division of vocational rehabilitation, \$29,000 for "jang's" disease control, and \$7,714 to the state blind commission for purchase of books for the blind.

Slots Revenue Loss Puts Legion Home On Sale

PORTLAND, May 5.—(P)—The American Legion's Portland post No. 1 has put its elaborate club building up for sale, because of the loss of revenue from slot machines.

The post said it would dispose of the big structure and seek smaller quarters, provided it receives a satisfactory price offer. The three-story building, which includes a swimming pool, gym, auditorium, dining room, and many lounges and club rooms, cost \$62,000 in 1946.

Al Greenwalt, chairman of the board of trustees for the building, said the post was not in financial distress, but did not want to continue losing money. The ban on slot machines has cut sharply into the revenue of almost all private clubs here.

"We've done everything we can in the past year and a half to maintain it and keep going," Greenwalt said. "But if we keep losing money annually, in eight or ten years our building will be gone."

"We have in mind," he added, "to get something more appropriate for a Legion post. We have to some extent lost sight of some of
