WASHINGTON. May 5 - (P) - President Truman today proposed that the long-independent Reconstruction Finance corporation be made part of the Commerce depart-

made part of the Commerce depart-ment as a part of a five-point pro-gram to aid small business. In a special message to Congress, Mr. Truman said his program is designed to help small and inde-pendent businesses solve their prob-lems "through their own efforts" but under federal supervision. The program would be adminis-tered by the secretary of Com-merce.
