

Portland Loses In 11th, 2-1; Hollywood Tops Los Angeles

The Hollywood Stars, 1949 Pacific Coast League champions, apparently are not in the mood to be mauled further by their cross-town rivals, the Los Angeles Angels.

They demonstrated as much in their series opener last night. Two weeks ago the Angels beat them five out of seven starts. But in their latest effort, the Stars proceeded to whitewash their neighbors 5-0.

Chuck Stevens' three-run homer in the first inning was more than enough, as things turned out. Plenty of credit should go to hurler Glen Moulder. He restricted the Angels to four hits, all singles, and allowed only two runners to get as far as second base.

Lose Hitter
In addition to losing the game, the Angels apparently lost their hard-hitting Clarence Maddern for a few days. He twisted his neck batting in the third and became so dizzy he had to be helped off the field. He refused hospitalization and was sent home. His ailment was diagnosed as a cerebral anemia.

Reliever Bob Savage halted a late Seattle rally as the Padres from San Diego manager to win 8-6. Orestes Minors provided the Padres fireworks, hitting in five runs with a homer and a brace of singles and scoring twice himself. The Rainiers picked up a run in the ninth and had two runners aboard before the side was retired.

Pitcher Max Surkont won his own ball game as Sacramento

edged Portland 2-1 in 11 innings. Surkont homered and then scored the final tally in the extra inning. His round-tripper came in the third.

Portland tied things up in the ninth, Dain Clay tripling and then coming home on Mickey Rocco's fly.

San Francisco and Oakland battled for 11 innings and all for nothing, as far as the standings called because of the late hour with the count tied up at 7-all.

The game was as wild as it was long. The Oaks ran up a 6-3 lead in the first three frames. Catcher Ray Noble homered with a mate on base in the third.

But the hit-happy Seals got five blows and three runs in the ninth. Each team scored once in the tenth.

Yankees Worried As Clipper Continues Bad Batting Slump

What's wrong with Joe Dimaggio?

The star outfielder of the world champion New York Yankees, one of the greatest and highest paid figures in the game, is in the midst of one of his worst batting slumps. Not only does it have Joe worried, it has the entire Yankee team concerned.

Dimaggio is the first to tell you that he's never felt better in his life. No aches, no pains, no back trouble and no sign of the heel disorder that kept him out of the first 65 games of the 1949 season.

What's Reason?
What then is the reason for his current puny .247 batting mark? The Yankee Clipper would give a large junk of his \$100,000 salary to know.

"I can't explain it," he said before last night's game against the St. Louis Browns. "All I know is that my timing is off. There is absolutely nothing wrong with me physically. I had a great spring. I'm in perfect condition. My weight is just right. I suppose I need more batting practice."

Joe, nearing 36, got in some extra licks before the game. Still he went nought for four as the Yankees defeated the Browns, 4-2. Lefty Ed Lopat pitched a three-hitter for his third triumph.

Dimaggio now has some six games with only two singles to show for his efforts in his last 22 games at bat. That's a microscopic .091 batting mark. During that time he has failed to drive in a run or score one. True, he was "robbed" of a couple of hits by some fancy Tiger outfielding last Monday, but the handle hit he got into short left field that day was nothing to brag about.

Too Old?
Is Dimaggio in just one of those batting slumps that every player undergoes at certain intervals? Or have the years sneaked up suddenly on one of the greatest outfielders of American league history?

Meanwhile, Ralph Kiner, Na-

tional league's home run king went on another batting spree last night. He blasted two home runs, one with the bases full, to defeat Brooklyn almost single-handedly. Kiner's sixth and seventh homers of the season enabled the Pittsburgh Pirates to overcome a 5-0 deficit and whip the Dodgers, 10-5.

Kiner's grand slammer, which came in the bottom of the eighth, was his second of the campaign and eighth of his big league career. That tied him with Philadelphia's Bill Nicholson for most grand slam homers by active National leaguers.

Only Rogers Hornsby, the old St. Louis slugger, and George Kelly, former New York Giants first baseman, made more. Hornsby hit 12 and Kelly 10. Lou Gehrig, famous Yankee first baseman hit the most in the majors, 23.

Purdy stated that Springfield high school appeared to be the team to beat for the district title. However, he said that his Indian trackmen are regarded as the team to give the Millers the toughest competition for the coveted district title. Purdy also listed Eugene and Cottage Grove, last year's winner, as strong contenders in a field of about 15 schools.

The meet is to be a double bill affair with class A and B cindermen competing for berths in the state championships to be held later in the month at Corvallis. First and second place winners in each event will be qualified for the state meet.

Last year the Roseburg trackmen placed fourth in the district meet. However, Roseburg was able to place three of its athletes in four positions in the state meet. This year, Purdy hopes to do a little better by qualifying possibly four of the Indian trackmen in six positions for the state competition.

The first week of trout fishing on the North Umpqua has netted the first for many fishermen, according to reports at Glide. Twenty-one trout caught by three fishermen at the R. L. Welborn ranch above Lone Rock ranged in size from 8 inches to 18 inches, one fish weighing about one and three-fourths pounds.

C. F. Moore, owner of a fishing tackle shop recently opened at Glide, reports that most successful catches are being made on single salmon eggs. "I got my limit Wednesday on a single egg on a number nine hook," Moore said.

All trout appear to be in good condition. Prospects for weekend fishing are good, providing excessive rain does not cause the river to become too muddy. Although the river is high, it has not impaired trout fishing so far.

SCHULTZ WINS SUIT
