Trackman Kemp Sets 2 Records

Roseburg junior high school's versatile track athlete, Jim Kemp, set two new records in the Willamette valley junior track and field meet at Springfield Tuesday evening.

Kemp ran the 440 yard run in a record-breaking 54.7 seconds, shattering the old record in the event made in 1949 by Merlyn Samples of Springfield with a 56.8 seconds time.

Kemp repeated his record breaking performance in the 880 yard run by bettering Merlin Jenkins of Springfield 1949 record time of 2:11.2. Kemp ran the half mile distance in 2:09.1 to set the new record.

Eugene First
But Kemp's performance was not enough to win the tough competitive meet for the Roseburg thirteens. Eugene took five first place honors and collected 53 points to win the third annual Willamette valley junior track and field meet. Corvallis collected 49 1/3 points for second; Springfield amassed 39 points for third; Cottage Grove placed fourth with 20 points and Roseburg took fifth place with 17 points. Thirteen schools scored in the meet.

Four other new records were made in the meet. Clayton of Springfield ran the mile in 4:58.8, topping the old time of 4:59; Crawford of Eugene cleared the cross bar at 10 feet 10 inches, shattering the old record of 10 feet, to establish a new mark in the pole vault; Roma of Eugene high jumped 5 feet 6 inches, bettering the old record by two inches; and

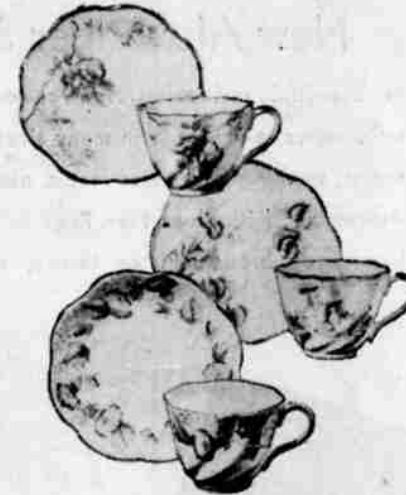

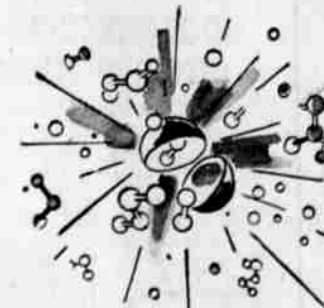
