Between 400 and 500 visitors are anticipated at the Veterans hospital for the annual "Open House" next Sunday, May 14, from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m.

Entertainment will be furnished before and after the tours by the Knights of Pythias drum and bugle corps. There will also be a baseball game in the grove between two teams of patients.

There will be a movie entitled "Voyage to Recovery" shown in the recreation hall at the end of each tour after which light refreshments will be served.
