Annual Red Cross Meet Scheduled

The annual Douglas County chapter, American Red Cross, membership meeting will be held in the chapter rooms at the armory June 12 at 7:30 p.m., announced Secretary Douglas R. Sims.

Purpose of the meeting is to review the past year's program, plan for the coming year, elect new directors and install officers for 1950-51.

William T. Evans Jr., chairman of the local organization for the current year, expressed hopes for a large turnout. Any person residing within Douglas county who is interested in community affairs should, if possible, arrange to attend the meeting, he said. At this time the entire membership may take an active interest in planning the Red Cross program for their particular community's benefit.

All persons having contributed one dollar or more to the 1950 fund campaign have voting power and may participate in the election of chapter board members, as well as suggest program plans.

The meeting promises to be of county wide interest, since last year there were nearly 3,500 beneficiaries of Red Cross service in the county and over 8,000 individuals took part in carrying on the program, said Evans.
