WASHINGTON—(AP)—The Washington Nats have come up with one of baseball's zaniest-sounding deals—they signed Joe DiMaggio. But the Joe DiMaggio they signed isn't the Yankee Clipper—he's his second cousin.
Farm Director Ossie Bluege said the 18-year-old Monterey, Calif., outfielder-pitcher has been assigned to the class D Concord Nats of the North Carolina state league.
"If he's only a third as good as his cousin," Bluege said, "we'll be satisfied."
The black-haired youngster, who looks and acts like the Yankee Clipper, is six feet, two inches tall and weighs 185 pounds.
He bats and throws right-handed.

Indians Defeat Sutherland, 11-3; Set Tuesday Tilt

The Roseburg Indian diamondmen overpowered Sutherland high school 11-3 in a seven inning practice game at Sutherland Saturday afternoon.

Roseburg took a first-inning lead with one run and added four more runs, two in the second and two in the third inning, to get a jump on the Bulldogs. Sutherland scored a run in the second inning, two more in the third frame, and then fizzled as Roseburg dominated the rest of the game. Roseburg's big inning came in the fifth with five Indians crossing the plate.

Geary led the Indian hitters with three triples for four trips to the plate. He was the only player in the ball game to get any extra-base hits.

On Tuesday, May 16, the Indians will play host to Myrtle Creek under the lights on Finlay field in a seven-inning conference game. The contest is scheduled to get under way at 8 p.m. If the Indians can get by the Vikings, they will ask for a bid for representation in the district competition.

Webfoots Rule In Dual Meets

Oregon ruled as undisputed dual meet champion in the northern division coast conference track and field world today with an 81 1/2-49 1/2 win over rival Oregon State college. But it was the double photo finish of the Washington-Washington State meet Saturday that took the fancy of the spring and muscle fans.

The Huskies and Cougars ended all square—65 1/2 to 65 1/2—with the day's final event, the mile relay, ending in a dead heat. Washington's Jack Hensley made up a three-yard deficit in the final lap to hit the tape simultaneously with WSC's Clem Eischen.

The Pullman meet brought no record breaking performances although Eric Roberts' 6-foot 5 1/2 inch high jump was the best ever made by a Cougar leaper.

Oregon's Bill Fell set a new meet mark with a 9.5 seconds time in the 100-yard dash and a new Bell field low with a 21.8 seconds running of the furlong.

Other meet marks set included Joe Fisher, Oregon State, two mile, 9:33 minutes; Dennis Sullivan, Oregon, low hurdles, 24.1 seconds; and Walt McClure, Oregon 880-yard run, 1:55.3.

The events wound up the division dual meets. The northern division meet will be held in Seattle Saturday.

Gene Taft, a junior college transfer who ripped off numerous gains including one 70-yard kickoff return.

Gene Morrow, a junior quarterback, completed six of 10 aerial attempts for the victors.

Jim Kemp Takes Second In Run At Eugene Meet

Jim Kemp, Roseburg junior high school's sensational track athlete placed second at the 440-yard run at the District 4 meet in Eugene Saturday, to qualify for the state meet to be held at Corvallis next weekend.

Springfield won the meet with a total of 102 points with Eugene second and North Bend third. Roseburg placed fifth in the district competition with a total of 32 points.

Good Marks Set

Frank Purdy, Indian track coach, reported that his runners turned in their best times of the season in half of the running events. As was expected, Roseburg did not pick up one point in the field competition.

Purdy said that, in his opinion, the meet was one of the most poorly organized and run affairs that he had seen all season.

The Indian track men that placed in the meet were: Raoul Stroup, sixth in the low hurdles; Bill Van Horn, third in the 100 yard dash and fourth in the 880 yard run; Erv Stritzke, third in the mile run; Van Horn, Jim Shrum, Jerry Sconce and Bill Wordin running in the 880 yard relay event placed sixth.

Pole Vault Record Tied

Jerry Sconce and Tony Bokaras vaulted 10 feet to tie the Roseburg high school pole vault record. However, the height was not good enough for the two Indian track men to place in the meet.

On Tuesday, May 16, the Roseburg high school students will hold their annual interclass competition. The points that each class makes in the meet will be added to the other points from the year long activities in the competition, for the interclass cup.

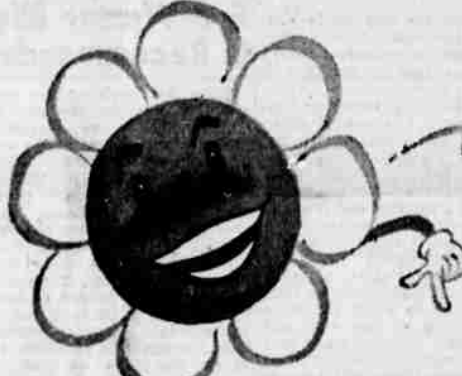
